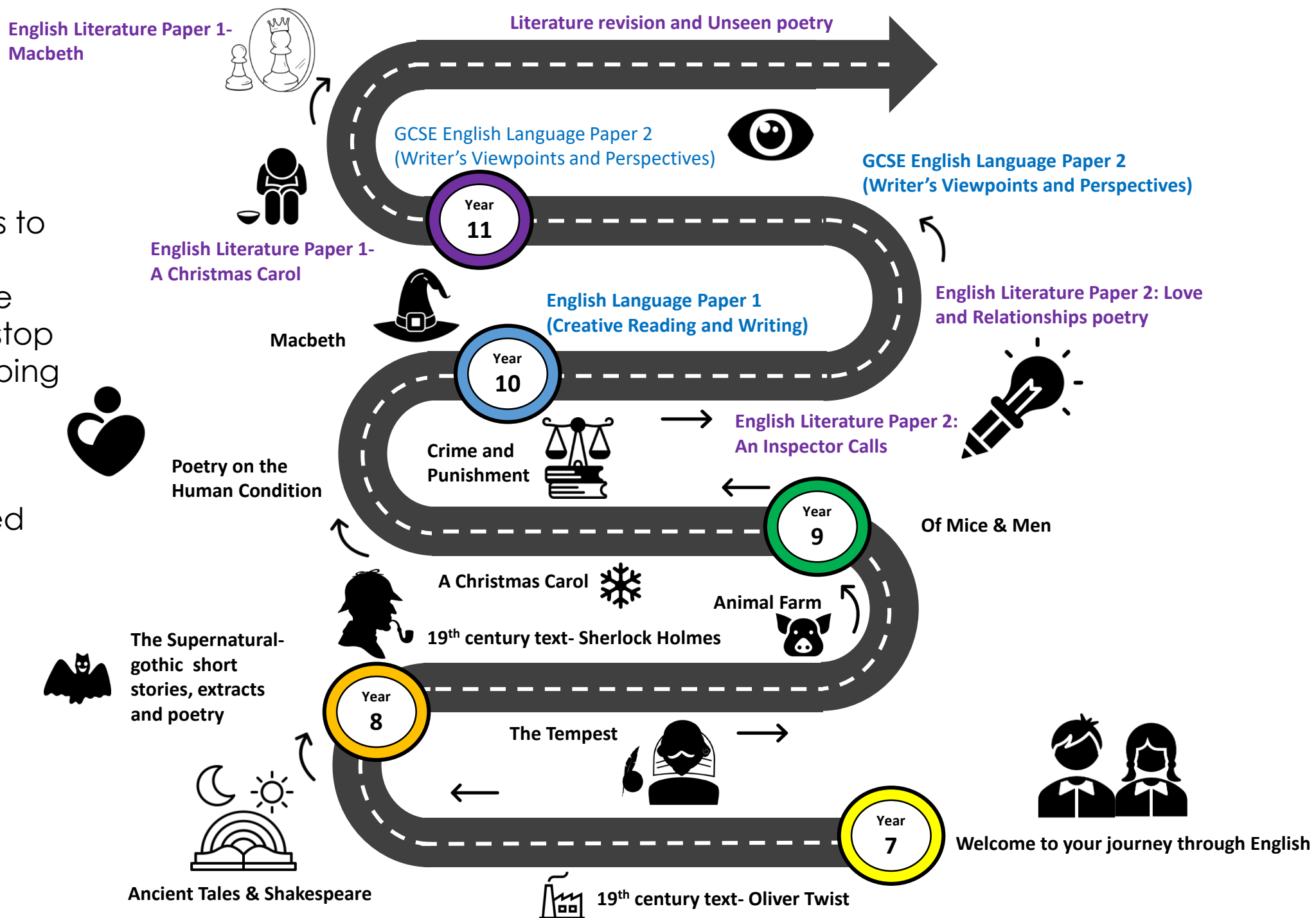

# Wanted



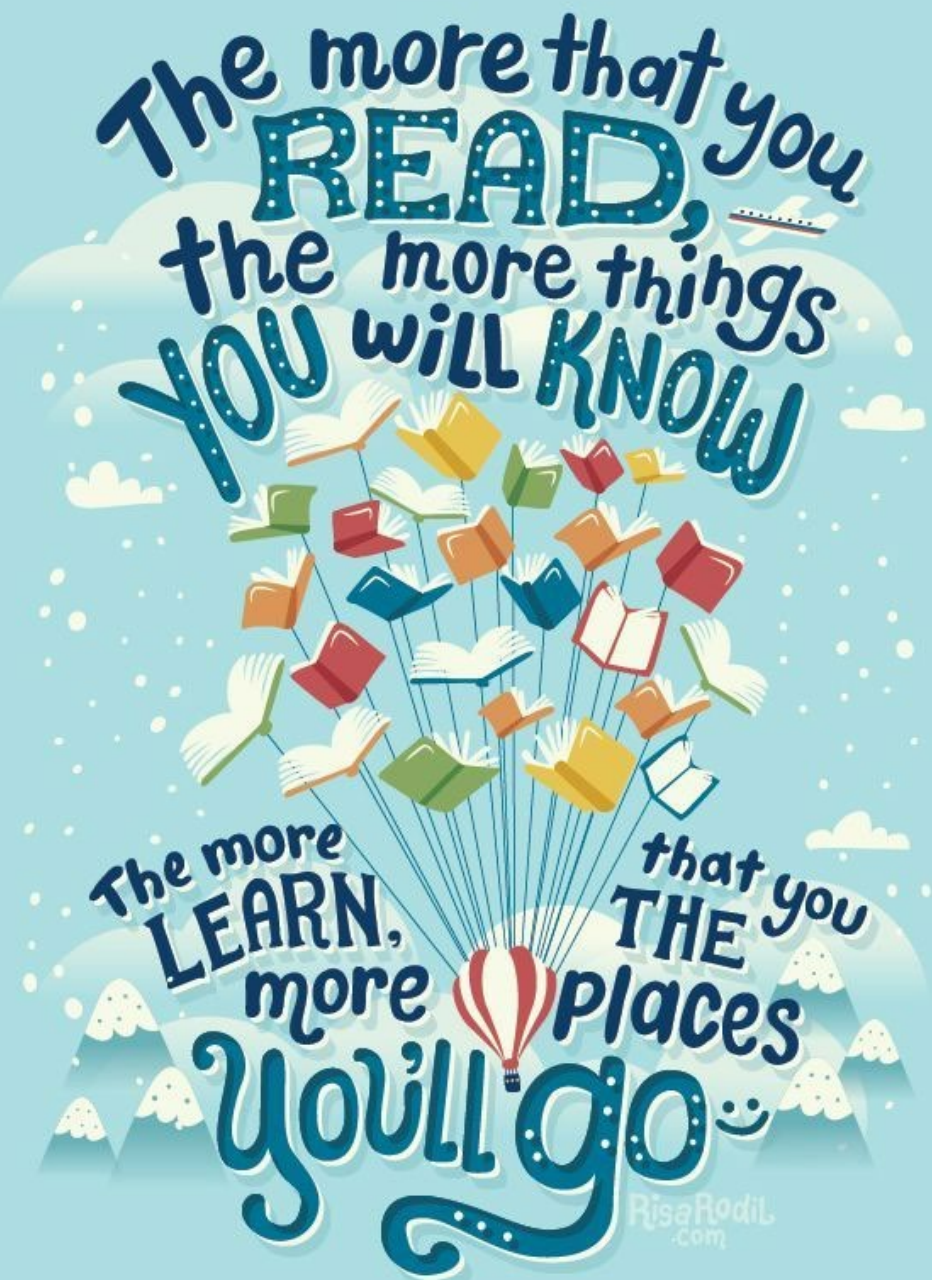
Bill Sikes
