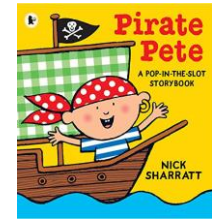

Our Learning this half term



Our topic for this first half term is 'Holidays'. Throughout this half term, we will be focussing on:

Literacy: We will continue to develop our literacy skills through phonics, letter formation and writing words, phrases and simple sentences. Through Drawing Club, we will look at stories and animations relating to the seaside such as Pirate Pete, The Night Pirate, Tiddler, and adventures from the past animation 'Captain Pugwash'.

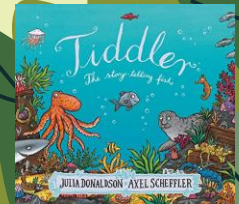
Maths: We will continue to develop our understanding of numbers up by counting and exploring numbers beyond 20. We will identify odd and even numbers, find doubles, number bonds and different subtraction facts.

PE: We will develop the fundamental skills through a variety of activities through our topic based on the seaside!

PSHE: We will learn how to keep safe at the seaside including the use of suncream, we will develop our understanding of the concepts of fairness and justice, we will also focus on preparing the children for the transition into Year 1.

Topic: We will be learning about transport, holidays and the seaside! We will compare holidays from the past as well as looking at different forms of transport and have an exciting day planned with the history man. The children will also create some magical sea creatures for Trawden Show!

Forest School: We will develop our confidence and independence through free exploration and learn to follow rules and boundaries through a variety of games. We will continue to observe how things grow, practise more knot tying and develop our fire lighting skills!

Reading



- We will continue to allocate fully decodable Bug Club eBooks each week, which focus on the sounds your child has been learning in class. We will also continue to add the *Action for Sounds* videos and games.
- These books and activities are essential and should be prioritised during home reading, as they give children valuable opportunities to practise and consolidate the sounds they have been taught.
- In addition, children will continue to choose a physical book to bring home, as previously explained in the letter sent at the beginning of last term. Please also continue to practise the tricky words that were sent home.
- Please remember to complete the Reading Record Book each week in relation to both the Bug Club eBook and the physical book, and return it to school every Friday.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Gates open at 8:35am (there is no school led supervision) Doors open at 8:45am Please drop off and collect your child from the main entrance door during our roofing work. Home Time is at 3:25pm this is a temporary measure to ensure the children are collected safely and to give adults time to then collect siblings if necessary during our building work - the children will come out from the main entrance door. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Each child has their own peg for personal belongings, such as their coat and PE kit. Each child has a tray to store their snack and anything that they make in school that they would like to take home. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> School fruit/veg is provided in the morning. Children are allowed to bring one healthy snack (i.e. fruit) for our afternoon play. No chocolate or crisps permitted. Please note that we are a nut-free school due to the severe allergies that we have. Milk is provided in an afternoon. Children always have access to their water bottle during the day and can refill it with water.

	<p>Gates Open – 8:35 a.m. The school yard is not supervised by staff before school. For everyone’s safety, we kindly ask that children do not use the playground equipment during this time. If a child does use the equipment, the school cannot accept responsibility for any accidents that may occur before or after school hours.</p>		

PE

All children **MUST** have their PE Kit in a draw string bag that is kept in school on their peg. It will be sent home to be washed and size checked each half term.
