

PE and Sport Premium Report

Trawden Forest Primary School

Funding overview

Total PE and Sport Premium received: £17,710

Unspent premium remaining at the end of 2025 to 2026: £0

The purpose of the Primary PE and Sport Premium is to support additional and sustainable improvements to PE, sport and physical activity. At Trawden Forest Primary School, the funding is used to maintain and improve sporting opportunities, develop staff expertise and support pupils to be active and involved in sport.

How the funding was spent

The submitted DfE return confirms that the full PE and Sport Premium allocation was used during the academic year.

Targeted support and inclusion

During 2025 to 2026, PE and Sport Premium spending was targeted to provide or improve opportunities for:

- pupils with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND)
- pupils with long-term medical conditions
- girls
- disadvantaged pupils

For 2026 to 2027, the school identified extra-curricular opportunities and access to external coaching and specialists as areas where targeted support from the new PE and School Sport Partnerships Network would be particularly beneficial.

Impact on participation and attainment

The PE and Sport Premium supports the school in maintaining and improving a wide range of sporting opportunities for pupils. The school reports that most children take part in sport at some point and that many participate on a regular basis. Funding during 2025 to 2026 supported extra-curricular provision, equipment and resources, participation in School Games Organiser activities and entry into external school sports competitions.

The school also deliberately targeted spending towards groups who may experience barriers to participation, including pupils with SEND, pupils with long-term medical conditions, girls and disadvantaged pupils.

How improvements will be sustained

A significant proportion of the premium was invested in continuing professional development. This included staff development in PE and specific upskilling to support the delivery of swimming lessons. Developing staff knowledge, confidence and expertise helps to build capacity within school so that improvements to PE and sport provision can continue beyond a single funding year.

Investment in equipment and resources also provides materials that can continue to support PE, sport and physical activity in future years. Memberships, subscriptions and involvement with the School Games Organiser network help the school maintain access to wider opportunities, events and competition.

Swimming and water safety

At the end of the 2025 to 2026 academic year, the following percentages of Year 6 pupils met the national curriculum swimming and water safety requirements:

National curriculum requirement	Year 6 pupils meeting requirement
Swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres	93%
Use a range of strokes effectively, for example front crawl, backstroke and breaststroke	93%
Perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations	90%

The school reported £0 of PE and Sport Premium spending on additional top-up swimming lessons or on broadening aquatic opportunities during 2025 to 2026. The submitted return therefore recorded no impact of premium-funded swimming expenditure on swimming and water safety attainment for this year.
