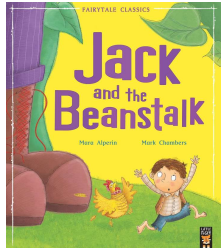

Our Learning this half term

Our topic for this half term is 'Growth and Green Fingers'

English: Our first theme will be classic stories and we will read and respond to versions of Jack and the Beanstalk. We will then write instructions for how to plant a seed.

Maths: This half term we will begin by looking at multiplication by counting in different steps and making arrays and division through grouping and sharing. We will also move on to looking at fractions of shapes and groups of objects.

Science: The main focus of our topic will be learning about plants. We will look at different plants in the local environment, watch plants and seeds grow and learn about what plants need.

Geography: Exploring the Uk – Learning about the countries, capitals and seas related to our country.

Computing: Moving a Robot. Learning about how technology is used and programming Beebots.

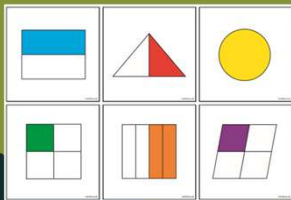
Art: Playful Making. Using 3D art skills to make plants or flowers.

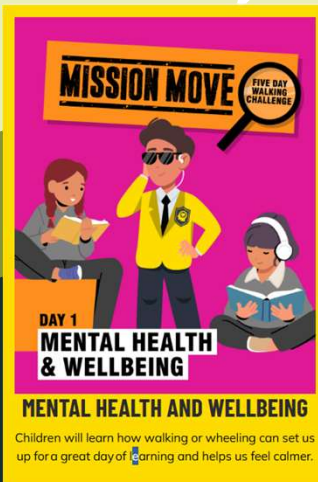
Year 1 Routines



Entering / Exiting (KS2 Yard Only)	Cloakroom	Snacks
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Gates open at 8:35am (there is no school led supervision) Doors open at 8:45am (Children will be met at the main entrance by the teacher) Home Time is at 3:30pm (Children will be led to the left side of the shelter on the KS2 playground just before 3.30pm and then will be let go by the class teacher when their adult is seen) NO parents are to use the staff car park or walk through it. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Each child has their own peg for personal belongings, such as their coat, bag, PE kit & Forest School Kit (on set day). 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> All children receive a free piece of fruit every morning playtime Children are allowed to bring in a healthy snack (i.e. fruit or sugar free snack) for afternoon playtime. This should remain in their tray (not lunchbox) until eaten. No chocolate or crisps permitted. We cannot store yogurt in a fridge Please note that we are a nut-free school due to the severe allergies that we have.

	<p>Gates Open –8:35 a.m. The school yard is not supervised by staff before school. For everyone’s safety, we kindly ask that children do not use the playground equipment during this time. If a child does use the equipment, the school cannot accept responsibility for any accidents that may occur before or after school hours.</p>

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> All children in EYFS and KS1 are entitled to a free school dinner. If your child brings in a healthy packed lunch, this will be placed in the Year 1 cloakroom until lunchtime. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Online books and games will be added regularly on Bug Club. These are linked to phonics and will be your child’s main reading book. Access will be monitored. Children are asked to practise tricky words at home to support reading. Numbots is used to develop rapid recall of number facts. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Home reading books and library books will be changed every Thursday or earlier if they have been read and the reading record is signed. Each child is expected to bring their reading book and reading record into school every day and have these in their drawers.

Walk to School Week 18.5.26 - 22.5.26

- Children will be asked to design posters to encourage others to walk to school.
- KS1 children will be learning and practising basic road safety skills.
- Children will have assemblies and activities in class to help them to understand the benefits of walking to school.
- Children will be encouraged to walk to school each day of the week and log their active journeys using Travel Tracker.
- Any children who walk every day of the week will be awarded a WOW badge.

















Year 1 Phonics Screening Check

- In June 2026, Year 1 have their 'Phonics Screening Check'.
 - The phonics screening check is a quick and easy check of your child's phonics knowledge. It helps to inform us where they may need further input.
 - Your child will sit with a teacher he or she knows and be asked to read 40 words. Your child may have read some of the words before, while others will be completely new. The check will consist of 20 'real' words and 20 'Alien/nonsense' words.
 - The check normally takes just a few minutes to complete and there is no time limit.
 - If your child is struggling, the teacher will stop the check. The check is carefully designed not to be stressful for your child.
 - The check will contain a mix of real words and 'alien' (or 'nonsense words'). Your child will be told before the check that there will be 'Alien/nonsense' words that he or she will not have seen before. Your child will be familiar with this because the school already uses 'Alien words' when they teach phonics. Alien or nonsense words are important to include because words such as 'vap' or 'jound' are new to all children. Children cannot read these by using their memory or vocabulary; they have to use their decoding skills. This is a fair way to assess their ability to decode new words.

PE
