Our Learning this half term



Our topic for the first half term is 'Castles and Dragons'. Throughout this half term, we will be focussing on:

English: The first English unit of the half-term is traditional tales with a twist based on the book 'Prince Cinders'. The children will be writing their own story with a twist based on their learning throughout this unit. Our second unit will be instruction writing based on the text 'How to catch a dragon'.

Maths: Addition and Subtraction & Shape.

Science: Animals including humans – Children will understand different life cycles of animals including frogs and chickens. They will also start to learn about the importance of having a healthy diet.

History: Castles – Children will learn about the history of St. George and will discover who used to live in castles and what the different parts of a castle were used for.

Computing: Information technology around us.

RE: Christianity – Children will be learning about the birth of Jesus and why he is so important to Christians.

PSHE: Relationships – We will start to understand what bullying is and how our body language can express our emotions.

PE: Dance - Children will be learning a dance related to the gunpowder plot.
