So what can you do if your child has finished all of the books you have at home? If your child uses Accelerated Reader, they can use MyOn to gain access to around one thousand books that they can take guizzes on using accelerated reader. Take a look using <u>https://readon.myon.co.uk/</u> A very kind teacher created this list https://padlet.com/AddeysLibrary/ och8okob5xfuggv7 which is full of superhero books you can read on MyOn and complete guizzes on. There's no need to filter and search in this way, just pick a book, read it and complete a quiz! Don't forget to use <u>https://</u>

Ukhosted72.renlearn.co.uk/2241451 to complete quizzes on the books you have read whilst staying safely at home to count towards your word count.

For our younger children, Oxford Owl <u>https://home.oxfordowl.co.uk/books/free-ebooks/</u> have free e-books across the bands which broadly match with our reading scheme in school. This is one way to safely access books and keep reading at home, and all you need to do is register for free on the website. Oxford Owl have also created phonics games and activities such as this one https://www.youtube.com/ channel/UCIIFxIfCNYQvsRepWxT7n8A to keep the learning going. In addition to this, the following
