As you are aware, school is working extremely hard to protect our children and staff by putting protective measures in place. We hope this, along with guidance from LCC and HSE, will provide reassurance to staff, pupils and parents.

In the event of a pupil showing COVID-19 symptoms whilst in school, then up to date guidance will be followed.

If your child or anyone in your household develops symptoms of COVID-19 then we ask that you inform school by phone and the most up to date guidance will need to be followed.

If your child is unwell, but not showing symptoms of COVID-19, we would ask that you not send your child in to school until you have contacted school. We will discuss your child's symptoms with you and agree whether or not your child can attend school and if not we will agree an appropriate date for your child to return to school.

Due to Government guidance, we will need to keep each year group sat together. Therefore, there are seven



areas set up for the children to use - parents need to be aware that these areas are in the same spaces (the dining hall and KS2 hall). This provision will be open from 7.30am – 9.00am then 3.30pm – 5.30pm.

If your child arrives between 7.30am-8.20am, the cost is £4.50 including breakfast.

If your child arrives between 8.20am-9.00am, the cost is £2.00 excluding breakfast.

After school club is £4.00 per hour (siblings receive 10% discount)

Where possible, we are asking parents to book the sessions they require in advance (if possible) by ringing Mrs Clay or the school office, thank you.

Mobile Phones USE OF MOBILE PHONES BY CHILDREN IS NOT PERMITTED IN SCHOOL. If it is a necessity for a year 5 or year 6 child to bring a mobile phone in to school, they MUST hand it in to the school office as soon as they arrive into school. They can then collect it at the end of the school day. If a child is found with a mobile phone in school, and it has not been handed in to the office, it will be confiscated and a parent will need to come in to collect it . Thank you.
