Please be assured that if you have any queries or issues, your child's class teacher is still the first port of call. Thank you for your continued understanding, patience and support!

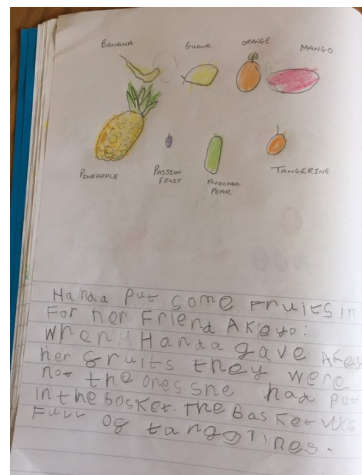

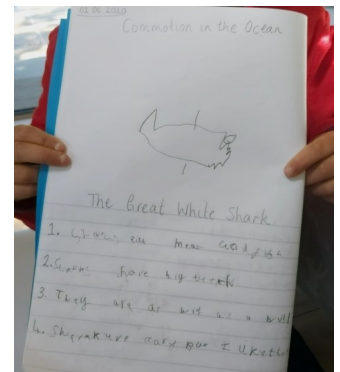
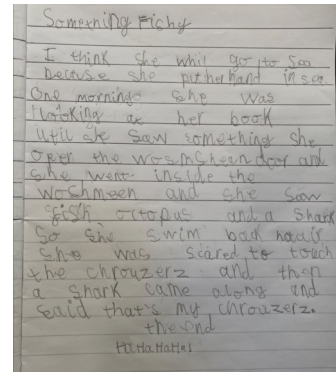
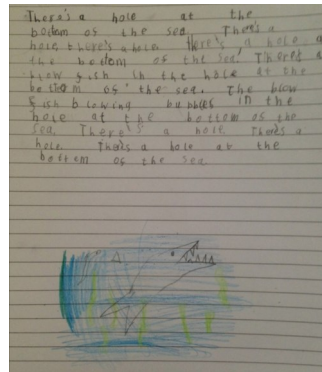
Hello Year 1

Hello Year three,

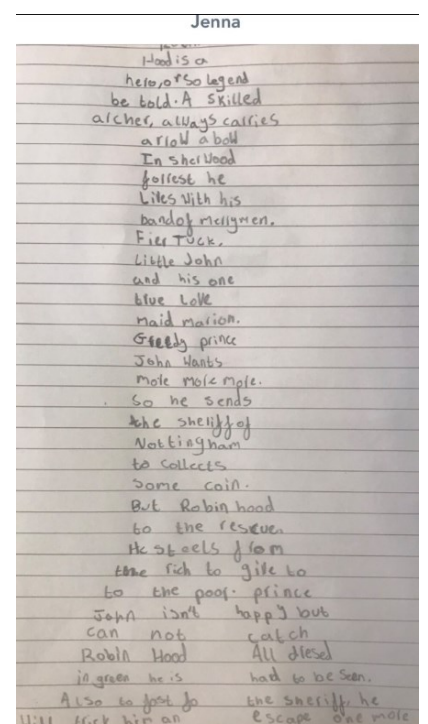
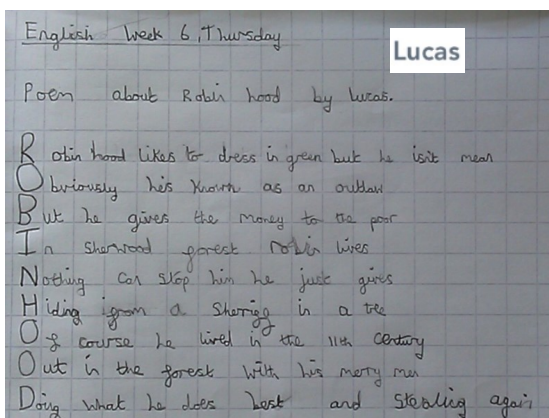
I hope you had a fantastic and restful half term in the beautiful sunshine, I have received some wonderful pictures of what some of you have been up to.

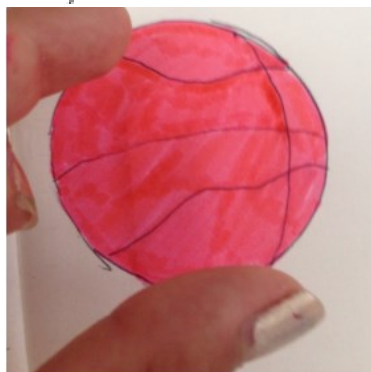
