We will be exploring the Stone age more in our history topic where the children will learn about cave art, farming and the inventions of early man. In science, children will learn about rocks, fossils and soils and their properties. In art, children will learn about cave drawings and will use

different mediums to create their own 'cave art'. In maths, children have been learning to use the column

method to add and subtract 3-digit numbers, after that we will be looking at multiplication and division. In English we are reading 'How to wash a woolly mammath'. Children will get the expertunity to create

mammoth'. Children will get the opportunity to create their own mammoths out of milk bottles and other craft materials. It is going to be a very busy and exciting half term!

Last half term was a fabulous one for Year 6. The children worked incredibly hard and it has been a pleasure to get to know them. As the term progressed, they began to take up important roles and responsibilities as well as proving themselves to be really kind and patient buddies to our new reception children. I

am sure that this term will be equally as busy and exciting!

Our topic this half term in 'The Pendle Witches'. The children have already shown a great deal of interest in this – which is wonderful! We will be reading a variety of texts and using historical sources to find out about the trials and tribulations of those accused. This will be followed by reading a version of Shakespeare's Macbeth beginning with a study of the three crones. We will also be exploring Pendle and its witches through Art and DT.

All this whilst looking forward to Christmas and studying Christianity (The life of Jesus) and empathy, kindness and charity through RE and PSHE.

Spellings: Please ensure that your child learns both their weekly spellings as well as the words on their statutory word list. They receive spellings on a Monday and are tested on them on a Friday each week. The weekly spellings are always on Seesaw. <u>Reading:</u> Please support your child at home by encouraging them to read daily and completing regular guizzes on Accelerated Reader – this helps us to track their reading and progression.

Maths: My maths homework is given out each Friday and is due the following Friday. Please ensure your children have time to complete the tasks.

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Firework Safety

Lighting fireworks is very dangerous and should only be done by a responsible adult. Don't be tempted to play with fireworks. If you go to an organised firework display, or if your family is setting off fireworks at home, adults should always follow the Firework Code:

- Keep fireworks in a closed box
- · Follow the instructions for lighting them very carefully
- · Light them at arm's length
- Stand well back
- Never go back to a lit firework
- Never put fireworks in your pocket
- Never throw fireworks

The only fireworks you should touch are.

Sparklers

- · Light sparklers one at a time
- Always wear gloves to protect your hands
- Keep your sparkler at arms length
- Be careful not to burn yourself or others

Make sure your pets are safe and secure at home - they might not like fireworks!
