PARKING:-

I understand how difficult parking is on Dean Street and how congested the road becomes at drop off and pick up times.

Please have consideration for residents and other drivers and ...

- * no parking in front of resident's drives or resident's access!
- * Please be mindful of your speed as you drive up and down Dean Street
 - * DO NOT PARK ON THE YELLOW LINES OR ZIG-ZAGS OR IN THE TURNING CIRCLE.
- * This is for turning only NOT parking as it causes a back up of traffic more than usual. This is to help to keep all children safe.

Parents and children must not park in or walk through the staff car park. It gets very busy at the start and end of the day. This is to keep everyone safe.

As 'lockdown' commences again, we have ensured that we have reviewed our risk assessments and procedures in school in light of our new guidance.

We would like to thank parents and carers for adhering to our

current procedures:

- only one parent drops off and collects their child from the yard
- the staggered drop off and pick up times
- the different entrance gates
- the one way walking system on the yard
- if you are waiting above the KS2 yard you stand on the grass area whilst you wait so that others can walk past at a socially acceptable distance
- junior children DO NOT come down from the KS2 yard to the KS1/EYFS area at home time to meet parents
- children do not play and run round on the yard at drop off or pick up times

We are doing our very best to ensure that class bubbles do not mix at all in school and we would appreciate this continuing at drop off and pick up times. Please could I just remind you of a few points - Parents are asked to:

- drop their children off at the allocated part of the playground for their year group and to please ensure that you maintain social distancing
- wait in and then pick children up from the allocated area for their year group on the playground
- the class teacher will let the children leave the line when their parent arrives - we do not want children running to meet parents at other areas of the playground and we will be asking children to wait until they are asked to leave the line
- we have ensured that there is sufficient space between the allocated year group areas on the playground for parents to please maintain social distancing
- as parents have collected younger children and walk up to the junior area of the playground please ensure that they stay with you and do not run around and mix bubbles

Everything that we do is to keep all of our children, staff and families as safe as possible.
