




WB 16th November Road Safety Week and Anti -Bullying Week

Children are asked to come to school wearing odd socks to mark the beginning of Anti-bullying week.




Tuesday 24th November - Santa's Reindeer visit school


Friday 27th November - Non uniform day—children are asked to bring in as many items as possible each to donate to local children and families in need (details of most needed items will follow soon)


