## Friday 19th June 2020—Headteacher's Note to Parents:

As you are aware Lancashire County Council gave schools the go ahead to begin their phased re opening for Years 1, Reception and Y6. We will START SMALL TO STAY SAFE and we are very much looking forward to seeing them. We are just sorry that we are unable to have all children in and get back to normal.

So, on Monday 22nd June, we will welcome back some of our Year 1 children. Please make sure that you have read the letter that was emailed this week. It contains important information about the children returning to school.

Then from Monday 29th June, we will welcome some of our Reception children back in to school. Again, please make sure you have read the letter.

We currently have 4 groups of key worker children in school. Then with the addition of the groups of Year 1 and Reception children we will have to look very carefully about where the Year 6 children would go and when it will be possible to have them back in safely. As soon as we know, we will inform parents. I hope that the Zoom meeting this afternoon for the Year 6 children went well and helped you to see friends you were missing. Thank you Mrs Clark and Mr Loynds for this.

Next week on Seesaw, we are going to have a "PICK 'N' MIX" week of home learning. The activities and worksheets that will be sent will be able to be done in no particular order. They will be based on sharing, fun, investigation, PSHE, enquiry, using their senses and imagination. All to help the children to understanding their feelings and emotions during this time and hopefully help to boost confidence, self esteem and wellbeing.

I would like to thank Mr P Wright and all of our governors for their trust and support during this time. The staff and I have appreciated the concern and understanding that they have shown to us over the last 12 weeks. Please read Mr Wright's letter to you on the next page in this newsletter.

Dear Parents,

I write to you at a time of unprecedented changes to our daily lives which has been felt by every citizen of not only the United Kingdom, but across the world. The impact of the Covid-19 pandemic has touched every single one of us in ways which, at the turn of the year, we could not have ever envisaged.

We have all had to find the resilience to face the many challenges that 'lockdown' has brought with it, no more so than the mass move from schooling to home education, for the majority of our young people and parents. To support that change it has required a massive shift in how schools could support both child and parent. I believe that the response from the Headteacher and teachers, in fact all the staff team at Trawden, has been phenomenal. The response of all our young people and families can surely be measured and celebrated through the schools weekly newsletter - my personal best read of the week!

Although the outward perception may be that schools are 'closed' and teachers are at home, the truth up and down the country is that schools had to make new provision to support home learners and make provision 'in-school' for key workers children and those identified as vulnerable. Teachers focused on providing meaningful learning experiences and platforms to support those children who found themselves at home, whilst not forgetting those young people who were accessing school. It has been a learning curve for all those involved, including the governors, who have focused on providing the necessary support to the Headteacher and the staff, but always being mindful to ask the critical questions to ensure that all the needs of all our young people and parents, were being considered and met.

The governors approved a plan on 21st May, to reopen the school initially in early years, year 1 and 6. This plan has been shared with you and although delayed because of the advice of the Director of Public Health and the Local Authority, it is one in which a lot of time and effort has been invested in. I hope that you will support the plan and ongoing provision for those young people who, for the time being, must remain at home. The Headteacher and school leadership team have developed the plan, against a background of juggling government expectation and guidance, with the reality of keeping all the members of our community safe with the resources available, and within a building which simply has a limit to the number of protective 'bubbles' or 'groups' which can be created.

Throughout this period, there has been a coming together of communities which have realised the very best of our society. I sense that Trawden Forest Primary School is one of those communities that has pulled together and found a common purpose to address the many challenges and issues that we have faced and will face in the months to come. To that end, I want to reiterate my thanks to Mrs Stinchon and the team for the support, guidance and learning opportunities offered throughout this period as well as you, the parent, for overcoming the many challenges you have faced in supporting your child in accessing the learning packages offered by the school.

Finally, may I take this opportunity to thank you for your support of our school and wish that you and your family remain safe and well.

## Hello everyone!




