READING BOOKS AND RECORD BOOKS IN EYFS KS1 AND KS2

Reception children will receive 1 home reading book to share and talk about with an adult, each Tuesday. Please remember to send it back the following Tuesday to be changed. Parents are invited to comment on the reading book and how their child gets on Tapestry or you could add a photo too. In addition an activity has been added to Tapestry entitled Home Reading which has further advice. Parents can either click in the Questions and Discussion Points box to add a comment or click Reply with an Observation to add photos, videos and comments. If you need any help or advice please do not hesitate to contact Mrs Alcock.

How to show reading at home in KS1

In Key Stage 1 we will not be able to send reading journals home for you to write comments in, instead we ask that you use Seesaw to keep a log of your child's reading.

Each week your child will be given 2 new books on their designated book changing day.

Year 1 = Wednesday

Year 2 = Thursday

Please note that your child's books will only be changed on their allocated day.

When using Seesaw, please could you upload a comment about their reading or a photo / video of their reading on a weekly basis.

To do this:

Log into Seesaw Click 'Add' Click 'Photo' to take a photo directly from Seesaw.

Click 'Video' to take a video directly from Seesaw.

Click 'Upload' to upload a photo (up to 10) or video already saved to your device.

Click 'Note' to write a comment.



Once you have added your photo / video / comment click the green tick

Reading in Key Stage 2

The children read within their band-determined through an assessment on Accelerated Reader. Children are expected to read each day and complete their Reading Record Book, by writing a few sentences about what they have just read. Once they have finished their book, they can take a star quiz, which asks them questions about the text.

They can also complete these quizzes at home by following this link: https://

The children have their own reading record where they keep a log of the books they read, notes on their books and their star quizzes. They are still able to use these books in KS2 (but not KS1) as they are the only one who touches them to keep them safe and they are kept in their tray and not shared. Parents can comment in these, on seesaw or by email to the class teacher. Each half term, children complete a star test and this assesses and updates the band they are reading within.
