Preparing Your Child for School

Starting school can be exciting and there are many ways in which you can help your child to prepare for his or her big day.

One of the biggest things you can do to help your child is to encourage them to be independent in all aspects of daily life. Please support your child to:

- put on and take off their uniforms and coats
- use a tissue to wipe and blow their nose
- use the toilet properly, flush it and wash their hands afterwards
- take turns and share
- to use a knife, fork and spoon

Reading stories about starting school and talking to your child about the kinds of activities that they will carry out in school, such as painting, writing, playing, counting, listening to stories etc., will also help.

The Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum

The Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) applies to all children from birth to five. The EYFS is important in its own right, and in preparing children for later schooling. The **Early Learning Goals** set out what is expected of most children by the end of the Foundation Stage.

The principles of the Early Years Foundation Stage are aimed at:

- Allowing your child to develop as a unique child.
- Allowing your child to develop positive relationships.
- Allowing your child to learn within enabling environments.
- Allowing your child to experience opportunities that will enable them to learn and develop.

These principles are delivered through seven areas of learning.

Three are considered 'prime' areas. These are :-

- Communication and Language,
- Physical Development,
- Personal, Social and Emotional Development.

The four 'specific' areas, through which the prime areas are developed, are :-

Literacy,

Year 1.

- Mathematics,
- Understanding the World,
- Expressive Arts and Design.



Each of the seven areas of learning hold equal importance and are delivered through a careful balance of adult-directed and child-initiated activities, with learning becoming more formal towards the end of the Reception year to prepare children for transition to

Forest School underpins our whole school ethos and teaches the children many skills such as team work, resilience and problem solving as well as developing their language and communication skills.

Play in the Early Years Foundation Stage



Play is a vital part of learning. Through play, the children explore and develop learning experiences, which help them to make sense of the world. They are given the opportunity to think creatively alongside other children as well as their own. They communicate with others as they investigate and

solve problems and are able to express fears or make mistakes in a controlled and safe environment. We provide a nurturing environment through which we support the children to develop their relationships with others and how to recognise, name and manage their emotions.

Topics

The topics which explored within the Early Years Foundation Stage will largely be directed by interests of the children. You can help to enhance your child's learning by allowing them to bring in artefacts and books relating to the theme, or if you have a particular interest/ work within an area which is linked to the theme, then



you would be welcome to come and talk to the children.

Home Learning

Research tells us that what happens at home makes the biggest difference to your child's early learning and development. Playing together, singing, enjoying books, visiting the library, painting, drawing and finding out through play about letters, numbers and shapes are important activities to do at home. These activities are learning opportunities. These learning activities will make a difference to your child's learning right up to secondary school.

Sharing books and reading stories will help your child to develop a lifelong love of reading.

We use 'Bug Club' to support our teaching of phonics and this is reinforced with games and activities. We will send phonics activities home for you to support your child with their learning. As the year progresses, your child will be given a physical book and set phonetically decodable eBooks. We will give you more information about this in the Autumn term.

If a Home Reading book becomes lost or damaged, please inform school as soon as possible so that your child does not miss out on reading opportunities.

There is a charge for replacement books.

Key Worker System

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All children in reception will have a Key worker. A key worker has responsibilities for the well-being of a small group of children to ensure that their emotional and physical needs are met and to help those children in the group feel safe and cared for.

Small groups foster close bonds between the child and the key worker in a way that large groups cannot easily do. These groups allow the key worker to better 'tune in' to children's play and their conversation to really get to know the children in the group well. Children feel settled and happy and are more confident to explore, and as a result become more capable learners.

At Trawden Forest, we use Key Worker group sessions to give children these opportunities alongside whole class and individual activities. Once the children have settled in in September, we will let you know who your child's key worker will be.

School Buddy

In Reception, all children will have an appointed school buddy from Year 6. These children will be a friend and a guide to our school on their visit days, their first weeks of school and other sessions throughout the year. This gives them someone to help them settle in, talk to and look up to.



PTFA

What is the PTFA?

We are a group of parents, teachers and friends from the community and our main aims are:

- To support the education of the children via fundraising and other activities.
- To foster strong relationships between staff, parents and others associated with the school.

How can you help?

We very much appreciate all the help and support we get from everyone and we are always looking for members.

The PTFA can only operate with the support of parents, family, teachers and the local community. Being part of the PTFA can be really rewarding and a fantastic opportunity to get to know everyone involved with the school and the local community.

It is totally flexible – if you think you could spare some time for planning, setting up, donating prizes, manning a stall or clearing up after an event then we would love for you to be involved.

Celebrating Success

At Trawden Forest Primary School, we always encourage the children to do their best and they are rewarded for good and improved work, behaviour and attitude.

In our Celebration Assembly each Friday morning, a child / children from every year group will receive a 'Star of the Week Award' in recognition of achievement and progress in class. They will also receive a birthday card from school on the Friday assembly before their birthday.

Attendance is also very important to us and whole class attendance is calculated on a weekly basis. The class with 100% attendance for the week is awarded a certificate.

We celebrate not only what the children have achieved within school, but also any extracurricular successes that they may have and children are encouraged to bring in any certificates or awards from out-of-school activities to be given in assembly.

If your child is going to receive an award on Friday, you will be sent a text message on Thursday lunch time to invite to join for the celebration assembly on Friday.



THE SCHOOL DAY

The gates open at **8:30am** and the doors open at **8:45am** and children should come in through their classroom door from that time. School finishes at **3:30pm** and children should be collected from their classroom door.

School Dinners

All children are entitled to universal free school meals in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2.



A selection of healthy, delicious lunch choices are prepared freshly on site each day and we recommend that all children have a school dinner. Our cook is fantastic and many of our staff have one each day too!

If you prefer, children may bring a healthy packed lunch in a named lunch box (no glass please). Within school, we encourage healthy eating and we ask that you please DO NOT send nuts, chocolate, sweets or fizzy drinks to school.

Drinks and Snacks

All children are entitled to free milk until they are 5 years old which is provided direct to school via **Cool Milk Ltd**.

You have the option to pay for your child's milk after they turn 5. You will be sent information from our milk suppliers before your child starts school with all the details on how to apply online for milk. By logging in directly with our suppliers, **Cool Milk Ltd**, you are able to opt in or out when needed. The lists are updated weekly in school. Children will be given the opportunity to drink their milk during the afternoon.



All the infant children in school are provided with a free piece of fruit or a vegetable each morning as a snack.

If you wish for your child to have a small snack for the afternoon, please ensure it is healthy and only send in one item e.g. fresh fruit, raisins, cereal bars etc.

All children will need to bring their own named water bottle into school which they are encouraged to access throughout the day. Please ensure that the bottle is only filled with water.

The bottles will be sent home each day so that they can be washed and then refilled for the following day. If a child drinks all of their water, they are able to refill it at school.

Contact Details

We use ParentMail - a parent's text messaging service to keep you up to date with newsletters, important events and notices. This system is also used to make payments to school. Please make sure that you give your details so that you will receive your registering email/text from us and then you can be added to this service. Further information can be found here.

Please inform the school office of any phone number or address changes as soon as possible.

Who can collect your child from school?

You will be filling in a data collection sheet asking you to name the people that you authorise to be contacted by school and who can pick up your child. This is a statutory requirement for the Early Years Foundation Stage. It is important that you make us aware of any changes which need to be made to the list. Please contact the school office if there is a change to who is picking your child up that day.

Attendance

Due to changes in government legislation as of September 2013, Head Teachers cannot authorise any leave of absence, such as family holidays, during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances.

If you do take your child out during term time and it has not been authorised, your child will receive an unauthorised absence.

Lancashire County Council school attendance officers regularly monitor school attendance. If any issues arise, appropriate action may be taken.

Appointments in School Time

We politely request that you make appointments for your child outside school time. We do realise that sometimes it is just not possible to get an appointment after school - especially if it is an emergency. Therefore, any appointments taken during the day will be unauthorised unless we are provided with evidence (letter/appointment card). Thank you for your support and understanding.

What if my child is ill?

If your child is ill, please phone school on the first morning of their absence by 9.00am.

What if my child has medication to take during school hours?

Staff will administer medication prescribed by a doctor (if it is required 4 times a day) but you must complete a consent form from the school office. Please hand the medication to the office staff.

Please ensure the medication is clearly labelled with your child's name and class. It is your responsibility to ensure that the medicine is in date and change it accordingly so please make a note of the expiry date. We will send the medication home at the end of each year.

Please note: If your child requires Paracetamol, Calpol etc. then arrangements can be made for you to come in to school and administer it to your child.
