"Parents are being warned about keeping their children safe online after concerns were raised about an app millions of young children use. Roblox is a popular multiplayer game that allows users to design their own games, play different games and has been called the new Minecraft. It has more than 30 million players - who are supposed to be aged between eight and 12. But concerns have been raised about children being approached by strangers online and receiving inappropriate messages with characters doing "very adult things" in the virtual world."

We know a large number of pupils will be using this app, as well as many others, and it is our joint responsibility to raise awareness and keep children safe!



Punctuality is an important element of school attendance.

Pupils who arrive late to school can disrupt the early morning routines of a school and often struggle to settle into their daily routine.

The school day starts at **9.00am** and we expect your child to be in class at that time. The afternoon session starts at **1.00pm** and again, prompt attendance is expected.

Registers are marked by 9.05am/1.05pm and your child will receive a late mark if they are not in by that time.

At **9.30am/1.15pm** the registers will be closed. In accordance with regulation, if your child arrives after that time they will receive a mark that shows them to be on site, but this will **not** count as a present mark and it will mean they have an unauthorised absence. This may mean that you could face the possibility of a penalty notice if the problem persists.

If your child has a persistent late record you will be asked to meet with the headteacher and/or a member of the management team to resolve the problem, but you can approach us at any time if you are having problems getting your child to school on time.

This is part of our Attendance Policy that has been adopted from Lancashire County Council by our Governing body and can be found on our website.
