Please note that the school car park is **not** to be used by parents/carers or family members to park in or walk up or down. Parents with prams who need access are still able to use the bottom large gate on the KS1 yard at drop off and pick up times.

Unfortunately, there had been a few incidents on the carpark in the weeks just before we finished for Easter and as you know, it is always so full with staff cars and we have deliveries coming at various times - so we made the decision to stop parents using it at all (as the amount of parents using it only added to the over crowding and potential unsafe situation).

I have taken the information to governors and I have spoken to our grounds and legal team at LCC. We are looking at a way possibly, for the carpark to be used only in exceptional or one off circumstances - but this has yet to be decided.

I understand that this may be causing an unforeseen problem for some people at this time but I am sure that alternative ways round it can be found. I know that Dean Street gets very busy and we have requested support from our local police and highways to help during the busy times.

As you know, our utmost priority is always to keep all children, parents and staff safe.
