Entering / Exiting (KS1 Yard)	Cloakroom	Snacks
 Gates open at 8:35am (there is no school led supervision) Doors open at 8:45am (Children met by Mrs Alcock at top EYFS blue gate) Home Time is at 3:30pm (Children released from EYFS top blue gate to parent/ carer by Y1 staff) 	 Each child has their own peg for personal belongings, such as their coat, bag, PE kit & Forest School Kit (on set day). 	 Children are offered fresh fruit/ vegetables at morning play. Children are allowed to bring in a healthy snack (fruit, fruit product or cereal bar) for afternoon play. This should remain in their tray until eaten. Foods which need to be refrigerated such as yoghurt and cheese are not permitted. No chocolate or crisps permitted. Please note that we are a nut-free school due to the severe allergies that we have.
Lunches	Reading	Drinks
 All children in EYFS and KS1 are entitled to a free school dinner. If your child brings in a healthy packed lunch, this will be placed in the Year 1 cloakroom until lunchtime. 	 Online books and games will be added regularly on Bug Club. These are linked to phonics and will be your child's main reading book and access will be monitored. Home reading books and library books will be changed every Thursday. We ask parents to sign the reading record when children have read at home. Each child is expected to bring their reading book and reading record into school every day and have these in their drawers. 	 Children should bring in a clearly identifiable water bottle each day which will be kept in class. They will be able to refill if necessary, during the day. EYFS and KS1 children are provided with milk from Cool Milk in the afternoon. If you would like your child to have milk, please visit the Cool Milk website where you will find information about registration and payment details.

Our Learning this half term

Our topic for the first half term is '**The Great Outdoors'** Throughout this half term, we will be focussing on:

English: Our initial focus is going to be on Harry the Happy Mouse, looking at traditional rhymes such as Hickory Dickory Dock and then reading and writing about the adventures of Harry. Later we will use information we have gathered over the half term to create an information text about where we live.

Maths: Place Value & Addition and Subtraction to 10. This is a recap on learning from Reception but making links between using actual objects(concrete) pictures(pictoral) and numerals and number sentences(abstract)

Science: Materials – sorting, describing and comparing objects and the materials they are made from.

Geography: Our Local Area – where we live, what our village is like, key buildings and areas in our village.

Art and Design – Spirals. Circular movements, using different media, creating sketchbooks.

Computing: Technology All Around – uses of technology and learning to log onto the school network.

PE: Fundamental skills – Movement, balance and ball skills.

RE: Christianity – God the Father. Why Christians call God Father.

PSHE: Feelings & Emotions – What is jealousy? What should I do if I feel jealous?

Forest School: Seasonal changes – signs of autumn, autumn art, animals in autumn.









Year 1 Phonics Screening Check

The statutory Phonics Screening Check takes place towards the end of Year 1, for this cohort in **June 2025**. It is an assessment to check that children have learned and can use phonics to read. It will include a combination of real and pseudo words using phase 2, 3, 4 and 5 phonemes. The check is completed on a one-to-one basis with a familiar teacher and takes only about 10 minutes.

Throughout the year the children will be taking part in daily phonics sessions, learning new representations of sounds and alternative spelling patterns alongside revision of previously taught phonemes and graphemes. They will also have plenty of opportunities to practise their phonic skills in continuous provision activities, reading sessions, phonic games and small group sessions. The children will be well prepared to show what they can do and will enjoy learning.

To support their learning children will have phonically decodable books assigned to them each week on Bug Club which match their recent learning in class and will also have access to fun games and activities on Bug Club.

More information will be given throughout the year to support you in helping your children.



All children <u>MUST</u> have their PE Kit in a draw string bag that is kept in school on their peg. It will be sent home to be washed and size checked each half term.


