If your child brings in a healthy packed lunch, this will be placed in the Year 2 area in the cloak room.	 Each child is expected to bring their reading book and reading record into school everyday and have these on their desk. We ask parents to sign the reading record books, when children have read at home. Our Year 2 target is for each child to read for at least five minutes a day. 	 Homework and spellings will be set every Friday and due in the following Thursday. Homework books must be in school by each Thursday so that new homework and spellings can be stuck in on Friday. 	

Our Learning this half term

Our topic for the first half term is 'The place where I live'. Throughout this half term, we will be focussing on:



English: Our focus is going to be on the book 'How to catch a dragon'. Children will come into class to find a real-life dragon egg, they will then look at instructions and their features. Finally, they will write their own instructions about catching another creature of their choice. We will then move on to traditional tales with a twist where the children will explore mixed-up fairytales and ultimately write their own version.

Maths: Addition and subtraction, Shape.

Science: Animals including humans.

History: Castles and Dragons

Art: Making sock puppets.

PE: Fundamental skills.

RE: Christianity – Why is Jesus special to Christians?

PSHE – Keeping safe.
