History...

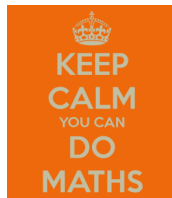
This half term the children will be learning all about prehistoric Britain. We will be discovering where the early humans lived, how they communicated, how they hunted and what tools they used. We kicked off our topic finding out what people in the stone age ate by dissecting some of their poo which was sent to us by an archaeologist! It was rather messy but we found out a lot!

(It was only a flour water and oxo mix, I promise.)



Maths...

This half term we will be focusing primarily on place value and then once the children are really secure with that, we will be moving on to addition and subtraction. Children will be comparing, ordering and representing numbers up to 1000 using a number of techniques. There is a real focus on maths mastery this year which will ensure that no child is left behind. Children need a secure knowledge of times tables to help them with all aspects of maths, I will be introducing a weekly times table test and ask children to practise at home as often as possible. I will inform the children which times table they will be tested on each Friday.



English



In English we will be studying 'adventure stories' for fiction and instructional texts for non-fiction. We will be using 'stone-age boy' and 'how to wash a woolly mammoth', both of which relate to our stone age topic. Children will be exploring characters and structure of adventure stories and this will build up to creating their own.

Year 3 will be taught the features of instructional texts and will explore the different language used. Again children will eventually create their own instructional text. During this unit children will be making their own woolly mammoths out of milk bottles. Could I ask for each child to bring a clean, empty milk bottle to make this possible please? Thank you.

Science...

Class 3's science topic this term is rocks and soils. The children will be learning about the different types of rocks and how they are formed. We will be discovering the different layers of soil and we will be conducting a number of exciting experiments throughout the unit. We are also lucky enough to have an expert coming to visit to show the children his fantastic collection of fossils!

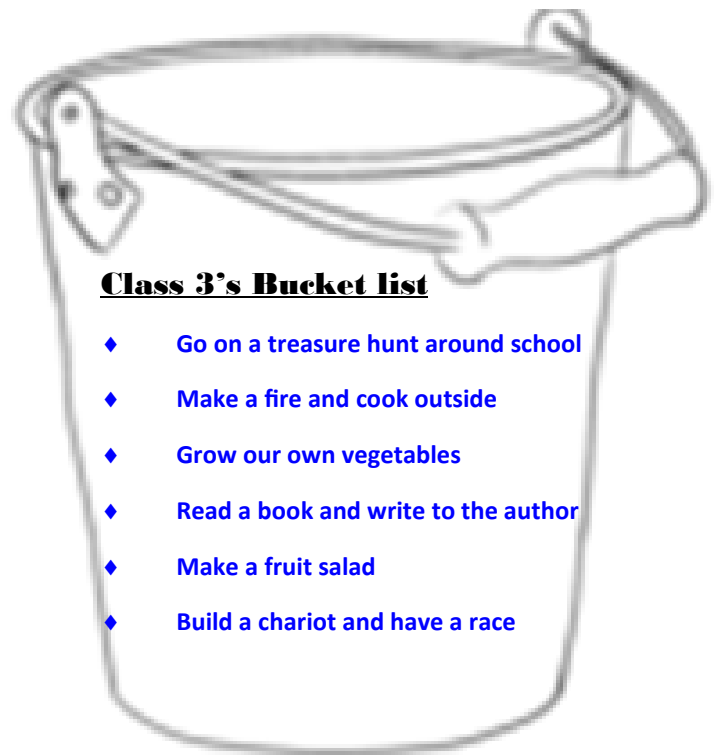

HOMEWORK...

Times tables, spellings and reading!

Children are asked to read regularly at home and keep their reading records up to date. These will be checked and signed weekly. If possible, when reading with your child, could you ask some follow-up questions to help build their comprehension skills?

Such as asking what the book is about, predictions about what might happen next and reasons for liking/disliking a character etc.

Spelling and times tables tests are on Friday morning. Each child has a username and password for Times Table Rockstars and are asked to practice regularly.
