Science...

This half term the science topic class three will be investigating is 'light'. During this block the children will create their own shadow puppet play using their expert knowledge and skills on light and shadows. They will make a theatre and puppets for the show in groups and conduct their own investigations on shadows, light and reflections.

Maths...

This half term our focus will be:

- Multiplication and division
- Measurement
- Fractions



We will be linking to our topic by looking at Roman numerals and learning numbers 1-12.

Weekly times tables test will be continuing this half term, we are now focusing on the 4x table for the first few weeks and then we will move onto the 8x table.

History...

Our history topic this term is Rotten Romans, The children will learn about the creation of the Roman empire, life under their rule and some of their greatest battles including the invasion of Britain.

Children will start with a big question: 'How did the Romans' lives differ to ours?' They will learn about where the Romans lived and how the Ro-

man Empire expanded over time. They will also investigate how certain features of our lifestyle came from the Roman times.



English



Through their work about the Romans and Pompeii, children will read Escape to Pompeii by Christina Balit and the Roman Record by Paul Dowswell. They will become fully immersed in what life was like in Roman times by undertaking research, taking notes & writing their own newspaper recounts about the eruption of Mount Vesuvius.

For their fiction unit, class three will explore Roman myths using Marcia Williams' The Romans: Gods, Emperors & Dormice and Romulus and Remus plus a variety of other Roman myths. Children discover all about the Gods and Goddesses of Mount Olympus and will then write and perform their own myths to an audience.

Don't forget...

Next half term year three will be going swimming on Wednesday mornings. Watch out for the letter that will be sent out this half term.

Our curriculum...

Design & technology

We are going to be researching and exploring Roman chariots and what they were used for. We will then be designing and creating our own and at the end of term, we will be racing them in the playground.

PSHE

We will be discussing friendships and what it means to be a good friend. We will be talking about what are positive behaviours and who is responsible for the children's actions.

Music

We will be looking at reggae music this half term, in particular the music of Bob Marley. We will be learning 'three little birds' on the glockenspiel and will be learning about tone and pulse.

Reading

MyMaths
