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Science...



Our science focus has turned to looking at

animals including humans. We will be learning about the skeletal system, the muscular system and diet. We have discovered this week that there are animals that are classified as vertebrates and some that are invertebrates. We are looking forward to becoming nutritional experts at the end of this science topic.

Geography

Our geography topic this half term is 'our local area'. We will be looking at Lancashire and obviously more specifically Trawden. We have already made some observational drawings of local buildings such as the community centre and church. We will be doing lots of field and map work and the children will develop their geographical skills throughout. A couple of children mentioned some of their relatives may have some old pictures of Trawden. If possible it

would be fantastic if they could bring them in for us to look at.







Children will be reading a variety of folktales for our fiction topic and focusing on a beautiful one called 'The Tin Forest'. Children will discover the features of a folktale and will write their own at the end of the unit.

Our non-fiction focus will be biographies; We will be looking at famous people from our local area and the children will choose who they would like to write their biography about.

Home reading

Please ensure that your child is reading at least three times a week, when they have done so could you sign their reading record and theses will be checked daily. They will need to take a quiz on that book when they have finished and they can do this at **Tuesday and Thursday morning playtimes.** It is their responsibility to undertake these quizzes and will have the opportunity to change their books every week as required.

Reading

Children are asked to read every night for at least 15 minutes, they are given the opportunity to change their reading books on a Tuesday and Thursday.

MyMaths

Children are set the MyMaths homework once a week and can complete this independently on a laptop or tablet. Is your child requires a paper copy please let me know.

Spellings & Times tables

The children are given new spellings on a Friday. They will also be told which times table they will be tested on the following week. Both of these will be written in their homework books and children are expected to practise at least 3 times a week.
