Our Learning this half term. . .



Our topic for the first half term is 'Germs, Masks and Mystery'. Throughout this half term, we will be focussing on:

English: Our focus is going to be on The Pied Piper of Hamelin by Michael Morpurgo. We will learn about the story, focus on the language used to create a terrific tale and then create our own fairy tale. Next, we will continue to focus on this tale as we aim to create a modern day newspaper report about a new plague of rats to occupy the town.

Maths: Addition & Subtraction, Measurement and Multiplication & Division

Science: Sound – How are sounds made? How do we hear sounds? How do sounds travel?

History: The Plague – How did the plague spread so quickly? Who treated the sick? How did the plague impact daily life?

Computing: The Internet – How can we stay safe online? What is the internet? How are devices connected?

PE: Basketball / Rugby – How can we effectively pass the ball in each sport? What are the best strategies to play?

RE: Christianity - How and why might Christian use the Bible? Who founded Christianity and where was it founded?

PSHE: Feelings & Emotions – What is jealousy? What should I do if I feel jealous?

Music: Glockenspiels – How can we incorporate these into a song? Which notes work best together?

Swimming

Thursday afternoons – 09.01.24 – 03.04.25.

Swimming Kit - <u>Towel</u> and <u>swimming costume (one piece)</u>, <u>trunks</u> or <u>swimming shorts (NO longer than knee length)</u> in an appropriate bag.

If your child has an inhaler this will also need to be in school, to be taken to the pool.

Swimming Caps - Both boys and girls, who have long hair (shoulder length or longer) will require a swimming cap. This is information taken from Pendle Leisure Centre.

Jewellery - This is not permitted in the pool. Therefore, earrings and watches should be removed by the children for that day or before leaving home if possible or removed and given to the teacher for safekeeping until they return.

Goggles - These may only be worn in exceptional circumstances (medical issues) due to safety reasons. These rules are based on Health and Safety regulations set down by Lancashire County Council and are non-negotiable. If your child has a medical reason for wearing goggles please request a permission form from the office, complete it and return it to the office before the first lesson.
