### Go Velo

Our class will have the opportunity to take part in road safety and cycling proficiency sessions with Go Velo this Half Term during 'Bikeability'. These sessions will happen on Wednesday 11<sup>th</sup> October and Thursday 12<sup>th</sup> October. Your child will receive a letter confirming their group and all equipment via Parentmail very soon. There are three levels your child can attain during these sessions;

- Level 1 –basic bike handling skills in a non-traffic environment
- Level 2 bike handling skills on quiet roads
- Level 3 personalised training to suit the child's abilities



Your child will require a fully functioning bike and a fitting helmet to take part in the sessions, these can be borrowed during the sessions. If you child cannot yet ride a bike, your child can still take part. The fully qualified instructors encourage and build up the confidence of young riders. These are fun, active and motivating sessions within which your child will gain confidence, enjoyment and an important life skill within.
