

Our learning this half-term:

In our topic 'Amazing Eggs' we will be finding out

Understanding the World

Kinds of animals, features, growth animals that lay eggs.

Expressive Arts and Design

Create own pet toy, paint a pet, making mystery eggs, acting out animal stories and vets/ pet shop role play.



Homework:

Reading books will be changed on **Tuesdays** and Fridays, providing an adult has commented in the reading record. Reading at home allows your child to practise and reinforce phonics learned at school as well as providing a focus for you to share books and develop a love of reading. Your child will also continue to have sounds and words added to their packet and may bring home sound sheets to practise letter formation and blending and segmenting skills. You can also support your child by encouraging them to write simple sentences. Your child may also bring home maths activities to encourage them to develop their counting, number understanding and problem solving skills. Library books will be changed on Wednesdays.

You can also support your child at home by:

- * Sharing books together
- Playing word building games
- *Visiting places of interest
- Practising counting and singing number rhymes
- Playing games such as snakes and ladders or bingo!
- Encouraging writing, including name writing
- * Exploring the outdoors
- * Gardening
- * Nature walks
- * Cooking
- * Painting/creating together.

Your child will bring home some 'WOW' vouchers. These are special slips that can be cut out, completed and sent to school to share any achievements from home. This could be anything that is a personal achievement for your child from learning to ride a bike to helping with washing up and will help to form judgements about each child's progress in EYFS. Please complete and send in whenever your child has something to celebrate.
