At Tregoze, the teaching and learning of Geography is based on the National Curriculum and linked to topics to ensure a well-structured approach to this subject.

Our curriculum is sequenced and progressive from EYFS to Year 6. Learning builds on previously taught knowledge to enable children to know more, remember more and use it to apply it to different areas of the curriculum. We can achieve this by developing and deepening our understandings of the world by: comparing locations, investigating, researching different sources, writing and talking about places, and asking and answering questions.

## IMPACT - HOW DO WE KNOW?

As a result of the Geography curriculum, children at Tregoze Primary develop a fascination and increased understanding of the world around them. They will be able to make links between the natural world and human activity, and understand the importance of being part of a community.
