

Intent: What do we want our children to learn?

PSHE and values education is at the heart of our school ethos and learning. Our PSHE curriculum aims to develop the whole child intellectually, morally, socially and spiritually in order to nurture rounded individuals with a strong sense of moral understanding and responsibility.

Tregoze Primary School is a values-based school. Through assemblies and lessons, the children are taught about these core values: responsibility, respect, tolerance, perseverance, trust, co-operation, empathy, kindness, patience, truthfulness, justice and friendship. At Tregoze Primary School we offer a broad and balanced curriculum which promotes the spiritual, moral, cultural, mental and physical development of pupils at the school and of society. We endeavour to prepare pupils at the school for the opportunities, responsibilities and experiences of later life.

British Values

Through assemblies, visitors to the school and lessons, we ensure the children have an awareness of the main British values. These are: democracy, the rule of law, individual liberty, mutual respect and tolerance of those with different faiths and beliefs. This helps them to become active and responsible citizens.

Implementation: How do we achieve this at Tregoze?

We use the Jigsaw scheme of work which was updated to meet the DfE statutory guidance for Health education, relationships education and RSE.

This scheme follows the key themes of:

Autumn 1: Being Me in My World

Autumn 2: Celebrating Difference (including anti-bullying)

Spring 1: Dreams and Goals

Spring 2: Healthy Me

Summer 1: Relationships

Summer 2: Changing Me (including Sex Education)

Impact: How do we know?

As a result of the PSHE curriculum, the children at Tregoze achieve their potential by supporting their wellbeing and tackling issues that can affect their ability to learn such as anxiety and unhealthy relationships.

PSHE helps them to develop skills and aptitudes like teamwork, communication and resilience. It helps the children be better prepared to make informed decisions to stay happy, healthy and safe. These skills and attributes are crucial to navigating the challenges and opportunities of the modern world now and in the future.

We use lesson and teacher observations, pupil voice surveys to monitor the impact of the curriculum. Progression is recorded through their jigsaw journals.
