

Key Stage: EYFS**Daily Learning Year Reception****Date: Monday 18th May 2020**

I hope you all had a lovely weekend. Please remember to email us with any photos of your child's learning. We will update the blog each Wednesday.

It has been suggested that if possible, you complete 3 hours of directed learning/activities each day with your child. Some of the directed activities will be repeated daily such as phonics as this is what we do in class. In addition to this your child should be completing 6 hours of creative learning and physical exercise (see recommended website for daily PE lesson) over the week. These areas can be fulfilled at home with activities of your choice.

The tasks below will take up some of the time and they will need to be supervised by an adult. Please do not attempt them all in one sitting! To make up the time to three hours please complete learning through play activities. Playing board games, puzzles, setting up a writing table with different paper, cards, envelopes etc. for independent writing, use a tablet or PC to complete maths games from the website topmarks, do cooking, explore the garden – weeding, planting and learning about nature etc.

**Phonics (20mins):**

Daily: Recap flashcards of all sounds (phase 2&3). Either make flashcards by copying the sounds from your child's sound book, download a free set from <http://www.letters-and-sounds.com/> or buy them from Amazon. Please practise reading the tricky words everyday with your child. Either use the mini flashcards at the back of the sound book or look at them on <https://www.phonicsplay.co.uk/> (**free access**).

Reading:

Daily: Please hear your child read one book a day and practise a word list. See if they can sound out some words and pick out any tricky words. Ask your child questions about the story, who are the characters, how are they feeling, what might happen next?

Please have a go at reading a book from Oxford Owls, there are lots of free ebooks to download. The books include Biff and Chip and Read, Write Inc (These are phonic based. They do not use the same colour bands as Biff and Chip). You can find books by age or level. Happy Reading!

Keep practising the High frequency words. If your child can read them, practise spelling them. (saved under 3 April 2020 phase 2 or 3 high frequency words.)

High Frequency Words- These words are a mixture of phonetic words and tricky words that the children should be able to read on sight (have instant recall). Please help your child to learn them starting with phase 2 words and then phase 3 words.

Writing:

I am learning to write some sounds in words correctly. I am learning to write a sentence or more that others can read.

Write 'My News', something you did over the weekend. Try to encourage your child to write independently, using the school script, sounding out. Remind them to use finger spaces and full stops. If your child is able to please encourage them to write more than one sentence. Get your child to read their sentence back to you and encourage them to point out the things they have done well and suggest one thing they could do next time to improve.

Handwriting:

Daily: Practise three lines in your school book of writing the letter or letters below. Each day we will give a different letter. Make sure your child is using the school script and put a finger space between each letter. Please do three lines of the same letter if your child is finding it challenging.

Can you try to join your writing?

Line 1 'm'

Line 2 'e'

Line 3 'me'

**Mathematics:**

Daily: If your child is not secure with numbers to 20 please practise reading these in and out of order and see if they can put them in the correct order. Practise writing numbers correctly to 10/20 either on a whiteboard, chalkboard or in the book provided. If your child is confident with numbers to 20 please practise counting to 100 and reading/writing random numbers from a hundred square - download from google images or Twinkl.co.uk

I am learning to halve a group of objects.

Can your child recall any halves from last week's learning? What is half of 8? Etc.

I am learning to count on to find the answer when adding two numbers.

For the first half of this week we will be basing our learning around the story 'What the Ladybird Heard'. Can you complete the ladybird addition sheets? Pick one that is appropriate for your child. If you can't print please make up your own in your book.

Topic/Expressive Arts & Design:

I can work with materials to create a model. I can choose what I need to create my work.

Can you make a ladybird with moving wings? What materials will you use?
