### Year 4

**Maths** – This week we will be completing a number of assessments as well as covering shape and the properties of shape. We are hoping to trial a new online Maths assessment in Year 4 and Year 3. We will also do a short paper based assessment.

In RE we will take time to rehearse our readings for the nativity and the actions to the songs. In dance the children will continue to add to their routine.
