National Curriculum Objectives:

Differentiation:

Developing Questions to support recognising and using apostrophes for possession with singular nouns that do not end in 's'. Using CVC, CCVC and CVCC words and high frequency words.

Expected Questions to support recognising and using apostrophes for possession with singular and proper nouns, including words that end in 's'. Using compound sentences.

Greater Depth Questions to support recognising and using apostrophes for possession with singular and proper nouns that end in 's'. Using a variety of sentence types containing coordinating and subordinating conjunctions.
