World Book Week

Continuing on the theme of 2026 being the National Year of Reading, earlier on in March we celebrated World Book Week / Day. Mrs. Avramovic championed lots of activities and experiences that we hope will support children in developing a love of reading and motivation to explore a variety of texts.

We held our book swap day, Year 4 joined the World Book Day live lesson, children dressed up as their favourite characters and brought the book in to show the book they were from.

Our older pupils visited our younger pupils and read to them, they also did paired reading. Teachers also swapped year groups and read their favourite children's stories to the class.



Year 4 Sports Leaders met with our Parent Association (TSSSA) this week to pitch a passionate plea for funding for new equipment to enrich pupils' playtimes.

The Trinity Sports Leaders worked in teams. Researchers asked all pupils across the school for ideas of the types of equipment they would like. They then brought the information back to the team. From there a team located the equipment finding costings and getting the best deals. This information was then presented to four members of the TSSSA and the Headteacher, Mrs Pennington.

The Sports Leaders amazing presentation and efforts have been rewarded with a provisional amount of £500 being allocated for them to spend on the requested equipment! Well Done!





Science Week

Mrs. Brech championed Science week, where our pupils got to take part in a week full of experiments and STEM. They made predictions, tested their theories and discussed and reflected on the outcomes to form conclusions.

The week was full of rocket designing, experiments, laboratory testing, exploring nature and finding out more about the wider world. It provided those links to spirituality but expanding children's knowledge and understanding of the wider world, our impact on the planet, and presented moments of awe and wonder!



Year 4 had a visit from the Windsor River Watch Team. Our Year 4 pupils gained knowledge and understanding on how they can help clean up our local rivers and support the vast eco system that exists within. Children also found out how to keep themselves safe when on or by the river.
