Dear Parents

Welcome back to the new half term. The week began with a call from Ofsted informing us that we would be one of the schools chosen across the country for an Interim visit. The purpose of the visit is to understand the barriers schools may be facing as a result of lock down and the return to full opening for schools. The day focussed on areas such as attendance, safeguarding arrangements, the school curriculum and behaviour. There was a significant amount of questioning around remote education both during lock down and going forward. I am proud to report that she commented on elements of our provision being excellent and unique across the country. Offering a range of subjects with the opportunity to join other workshops such as the dance workshop was impressive. I would like to thank all the staff for their creativity and working so hard during this time. The day went well and there will be a letter sent to parents from Ofsted shortly.

In the light of rising Coronavirus numbers both nationally and locally and a new lock down I have reviewed the school risk assessment. The risk assessment can be found on the school website by following the link: https://www.tssfirst.co.uk/parents/helpful-hint

The changes made are:

- All visitors to school, those not employed by the school, must wear masks or face coverings whilst inside the building.
- Only one parent or carer to enter the school premises whilst dropping off and collecting children.
- We will be open to essential visitors only.

During the lock down period we will be taking the children outside more frequently to complete the 'golden mile' to ensure that during the shorter days all children have access to a good level of physical exercise.

Next week we will be commemorating Remembrance Day on Wednesday by joining together for a virtual assembly and then meeting outside for the silence. I am thrilled to say that we have also been working on a piece of Remembrance themed art work which can now be seen at the Dedworth Road Tesco Store.

We will also be supporting the British Legion Poppy Appeal as we normally do. Our contact at the British Legion has kindly left boxes of the poppy themed items for children to purchase as well as the traditional poppies.
