Our learning this week:

Maths – we will be focussing on estimating and measuring length using metres, centimetres and millimetres. We will look at calculating perimeter.

English – We will be looking at some poetry this week and the use of rhyme, alliteration and rhythm. We will write our own verses for a class poem.

Spellings – this week we will be practising words that follow this pattern: The /I/ sound spelt y elsewhere than at the end of words.

Foundation subjects – In science we looking at magnets and we will start with which metals are magnetic and move on to looking at the strength of different magnets. In RE we will be looking at the story of Christmas as part of our discussions about the meaning of Christmas for Christians. Our PE lessons are being provided by Mr Hawkes on Fridays and the Windsor Sports Partnership on Tuesday in our final Dance session. We will be looking at building the pyramids in History.
