Welcome back and thank you all for working so hard to help with the remote learning while the children have been at home.

Our learning this week:

Maths – we will be revising some work done at home including column addition, adding mass, length and capacity, and drawing bar graphs and pictograms.

English – We will be looking at A Midsummer Night's Dream for a couple of lessons as well as working on completing our non-chronological reports about William Shakespeare. We will also be assessing the children's reading so that we can get them onto new reading book levels if needed.

Spellings – star spellings

Foundation subjects – In science we will be looking at the structure and function of the skeleton. In geography we will continue to look at the physical features of South America. Our RE lessons will now focus on the Easter Story for Christians and our question 'What is good about Good Friday?' Mr Hawkes will be teaching PE on Fridays and I will be teaching it on Tuesday afternoons. Mr Murray will be back from next week for trombone lessons.

Homework this week:

For the rest of this term we will be focussing on spelling, reading and learning times tables for homework.

Spellings: Star Challenge colour spelling words. I have assumed that most of you were successful when you did these at home a few weeks ago and so you will have moved up to the next set of words. We will be testing these words on Friday.



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Reading: Reading books will be provided on Monday and should be returned on Thursday mornings as we were doing in the Autumn Term.

TTRockstars: This is a very important part of the learning for your child. Please help them to do a few games every day if possible as they need to be familiar with using a keyboard, and quick, to answer the questions. Other ways of learning these number facts are important too but they will need to be able to complete the times table check in Year 4 using a keyboard.
