#### **July 2020**

#### Risk must be reduced through:

A requirement that people who are ill stay at home

Robust hand and respiratory hygiene

**Enhanced cleaning arrangements** 

Active engagement with NHS Test and Trace

Formal consideration of how to reduce contacts and maximise distancing between those in school wherever possible and minimise the potential for contamination so far as is reasonably practicable
