# This week in Year 3

## Monday 16th June 2025

**English:** Continuing with our unit on persuasive writing, we will develop then write the script for a persuasive TV advert using the language techniques that we have explored in earlier lessons.

**Maths:** We will continue our work on time with telling time on analogue clocks to the nearest minute. Then, time permitting, we will move on to digital time. Please reinforce this work at home by working with your child to read both analogue and digital times.

Later in the week we will continue to work on fractions.

#### Homework:

The homework handed out on Friday consisted of either some English work using homophones or, for some, some sentence work using capital letters and full stops. A Maths activity on fractions accompanied this. The homework is due in on **Wednesday 18**<sup>th</sup> **June.** If, due to exceptional circumstances, this homework is likely to be late, please let us know as soon as possible. 10 minutes reading and 5-10 minutes times tables and number bond practice should also form part of your child's daily routine.

### Spellings:

In the test on **Wednesday 18th June, most** children will be tested on homophones and near homophones: berry /bury, missed/mist, grate/great, grown/groan, plain/plane, weather/whether.

<u>New spellings</u> will be sent out on Wednesday after the test. The new words will be words with the /sh/ sound spelt ch: chef, chalet, machine, brochure, chute, parachute, chauffeur, moustache, charades, champagne. The new words will be tested on **Wednesday 25<sup>th</sup> June.**
