Maths – In Maths this week we are continuing to look at fractions and will be finding fractions of amounts and objects.

English – We will be looking at a narrative poem this week with particular focus on how we can create a picture with words and building on the noun phrase work from last week.

Spellings - This week the spelling patterns that we will look at are:

- The /l/ sound spelt '-al' at the end of a word
- The /l/ sound spelt '-il' at the end of the word
- The sound of the week is the o-e split diagraph.
- We will also be testing the colour spelling words this week or next week if you are isolating.

Foundation – In History we will look at the story of how Tutankhamun's tomb was found by Howard Carter. In PE we will be swimming on Wednesday, Mr Hawkes will teach us on Friday and we will also have the final session provided by the Windsor Sports Partnership about Healthy Minds on Wednesday afternoon. In RE we will looking at the Christmas Story. In Science we will plan an investigation into the effect friction can have on a moving object. In Art we will

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be doing some planning on our final project of the term which is to make a Christmas card using block printing.

Homework

Spellings: spellings are in the red folder and will come home on Friday. They are tested on the following Friday. These are the weekly spellings based on common patterns found in words.

Times tables:

20 minutes of TTRockstars is the minimum number of games that should be played each week. The session runs from 8.30am on Friday mornings to the following Friday morning. Your child may also be given a sheet of tables or other work to complete. Do let me know if you are having trouble logging in.

The 'Hit-the-button' website is a great place to practise number bonds to 10, 20 and 100 – these are key facts for children to have a fast and accurate recall of. Doubling and halving and times tables can also be practised on this site.

Reading:

Reading a variety of genres is very important and we are encouraging them to select from both fiction and non-fiction sections of their book band. When they move up a level, an advice sheet on how to help your child is sent home. It helps their comprehension if you can talk with them about what they are reading. Questions about what they think will happen next or why a character feels like this are good places to start. Children should be encouraged to give a reason (based on what they have read in the text) to support their opinion.

Bug Club is available via the Activelearn login. If you run out of books to read I can add some to your child's account. There are comprehension quizzes attached to the books by clicking on the symbols on the page of the book.
