Year 4

Maths – In Maths we will be problem solving using our addition and subtraction skills. This will involve answering one and two step questions. Towards the end of the week we will begin to focus on multiplication, ready for Term 2.

English – The children will be writing their letters to Dumbledore to apply for a place at Hogwarts in September next year. Will it be St Edward's, Trevelyan or Hogwarts?

Foundation – We begin this week with a trip to the Museum of Eton life. The children will complete a workshop on Remembrance. They will have their final dance lesson with Sarah, from 4motion on Wednesday. In RE we will finish the current module by finding out about the Jewish synagogue. In Geography we will cover the 'mountains' lesson which had been planned for earlier in the term. The children will learn about mountains in the UK as well as the conditions and climate to expect as you climb a mountain. We will finish our Lowry topic with our Windsor High Street Lowry drawing.

Homework

This week the children have two colour spelling sheets for homework. We will test colour spellings on Thursday and give them the opportunity to complete two tests, if they wish. There will be no timestables sheet this week but there will be sheets available in the classroom, should any children want to take them home to practise.
