Harmony in Diversity Concert

On Tuesday 24th June, Ealing Music Service presented a special celebration of music in Ealing with their 'Harmony in Diversity' concert at the Royal Albert Hall. Students from Twyford CofE Academies Trust performed in a number of parts of the concert:

Singers from Twyford and Ealing Fields sang in a massed choir of 1000 children, and took a leading role in the world premiere of 'Ada in Ealing', a new work by local composer Laura Rossi, with lyrics by children's author and Questors theatre alumnus Michael Rosen.

Four students from Ada Lovelace acted as the Narrators and were able to welcome them both to the school ahead of the concert.

Additionally, the Samba Band from Ealing Fields, and a mixed Djembe group from Ada Lovelace and William Perkin performed in a special work called 'Around the World in 80 Days' by Stefan Defilet which included music from Senegal, India and Latin America.

There were also students from all four Trust schools performing as members of the Ealing Youth Orchestra and Cadenza Ensembles.

The concert was an incredible experience for all involved.

Christian Aid's 80th Anniversary Service

Students from Twyford Church of England High School joined a global congregation at Westminster Abbey, for a special service to mark the 80th anniversary of international development agency Christian Aid.

The event involved some 2,000 guests, from staff and supporters to church leaders and charity partners from around the world, who came together to reflect on achievements of the past eight decades, give thanks, and recommit to the charity's mission to end global poverty.

The service opened with an uplifting performance of "We are marching in the Light of God" led by Twyford's Sacred Choir with the Kingdom Choir and Emmanuel Smith. Later in the service they returned with a newly reimagined version of "When I Needed a Neighbour" written by Sydney Carter for the charity's 20th birthday.





Sixty years on, the hymn has been re-imagined with the help of Rev Ally Barrett who has written new lyrics reflecting issues in the world today with an arrangement by Marsha Morrison and Marc Morrison from The Kingdom Choir. Choir conductor Karen Gibson MBE posted a <u>video on Instagram</u> about the event.

Three of our Y12 Digital T Level students (recent alumni of Ealing Fields) were selected for the prestigious 6-week work placement at IBM. Over the course of the placement they have put the technical skills learnt on the T Level course into practical use such as generative AI, SQL and backend development. They were tasked to develop an application and follow the process through from designing, coding, testing to user acceptance testing.

VE Day 80th anniversary

On Thursday 8th May 2025, marking the 80th anniversary of VE Day, Ealing Fields students attended and contributed to a ceremony to commemorate SOE agent and wartime hero Odette Sansom. English Heritage unveiled a blue plaque on the house in Ealing where she had lived prior to the outbreak of the Second World War. On her return from active duties in France she became the first woman to be awarded the George Cross.



Double NFL Flag Champions

On Tuesday, 17th June 2025, Ealing Fields proudly had two teams competing in the national finals of the NFL Flag Championship. We are thrilled to announce that both our Under-15 girls' team and our Under-13 mixed team emerged victorious in their respective tournaments and are now both national champions!

The Under-13 mixed team will go on to represent Great Britain in a tournament in Ohio, USA later this month, while the Under-15 girls' team will represent Great Britain in the European Championships held in Paris at the end of September. Huge congratulations to both teams.





Founders Day

This year we focused on "All the Small Things" and welcomed keynote speakers Prof Ray Owens from the Rosalind Franklin Institute and Dr Rebecca Jeffery, a post-doctoral researcher both from Oxford University. Other highlights of the day included "Snot, Sick & Scabs" a workshop from Centre of the Cell at Queen Mary's University and a visit from Animals UK who brought a chameleon, a skunk, a tarantula, a tortoise and a "little owl"

with them for students to handle and study. We also had a very interactive talk from Professor Hal Sosabowski on "Science and the Law" drawing on one of his many specialisms, forensic science. Other presenters came from the University of West London, Imperial College, London School of Health & Tropical Medicine, the Sainsbury Wellcome Centre, Synthoma, Harbour Energy and the Canals & Rivers Trust.

Special mention goes to Nancy Shehata, one of our own alumni, who returned to WP from Kingston University to talk about her studies in automotive engineering including her work on the "Formula Student" team designing a racing car. The big finale was an explosive show from the Royal Institution in the PC.
