Onatti came to Ada Lovelace in March when we were transported to a campsite for Auf dem Campingplatz. Year 8 students from Ada Lovelace and Year 9 students from our affiliate schools William Perkin and Twyford enjoyed the play which was performed entirely in German and really tested their comprehension skills and ability to work things out from context. We are particularly proud of two Ada Lovelace students who were invited onto the stage for the duration of the play, becoming a part of the troupe. Their pronunciation in German was faultless and they were even able to improvise in the foreign language!

Deutsche Schule visit



Ada Lovelace hosted students from the Deutsche Schule London as part of #ShoutOutForGerman week. Students visited German lessons and participated in speaking activities to get to know each other and share cultural experiences of German and UK schools.

Holy Family Project

We have completed our first term of teaching KS2 German at Holy Family Catholic Primary School, in collaboration with the Goethe-Institut. Years 3, 4 and 5 have been following the story of Wuschel, created by Axel Scheffler and the Goethe-Institut. Students had one lesson per week and have made superb progress. We are looking forward to sharing our progress soon via the NCLE language teacher platform, especially since we have welcomed in a film crew to follow some of the lessons.

Holy Family also hosted some students from Deutsche Schule London during #ShoutOutforGerman week to support lessons and enjoy a bilingual lunch. Headteacher Mr Doherty said "Thursday was fantastic - we were so impressed by the German pupils and our children really enjoyed the day".





We also presented on our pilot programme teaching German at KS2 at Holy Family in collaboration with the Goethe-Institut at the ALL conference.

At the Making the Case for German conference at the Goethe-Institut Ms Lyon met Dr Daniela from The Europa School UK, who is also teaching primary German using the Wuschel resources.



German workshop at Francis Holland

GCSE students completed German drama performances, while A-level students enjoyed university lectures delivered by UCL, Warwick and Bristol on German history, film and translation.

Anthea Bell competition
