





Noah Farr Student at Swansea Medical School

As students, we sometimes view the future with uncertainty. Noah Farr, a former student at Twyford has earned himself a place at Swansea Medical School, a university with a competitive healthcare programme and we were lucky enough to have him open to sharing his post-Twyford experience with us.

CIAG: What did you do after A Levels?

Noah: I applied for Sports Science at Loughborough University, where I am currently in my third year, writing the final year project on 'The Effect of Strength Training on Muscle Morphology in Endurance Athletes'. I've always had a strong passion for sport, hence I thought Loughborough was the place for me as they have fantastic sporting facilities, several gyms on site and a lovely campus. Sports Science has been really interesting - we've covered modules such as biomechanics, physiology and nutrition, where I really felt my maths and biology knowledge came in handy. I've also engaged in a few extra-curricular adventures advertised by the university, including the Wild Packs/ Camp America Programme, where I served as a Camp Counsellor for 2 months in North Carolina, USA, which was one of the most challenging, incredible and joyful experiences of my life. I also took part in the Uganda Volunteer Project through Play Action International, where during my second year of studies I fundraised just over £1000 to go towards the construction materials for a primary school playground in Jinja, Uganda. I then flew out to Uganda with a group of other university students, where we worked together to build, paint and decorate the playground over 2 weeks. Schools over there are a hub and symbol for the whole community and so getting to contribute to the project and experience a new culture was amazing!

CIAG: When did you leave Twyford?

Noah: I left Twyford after finishing my A Levels at the end of Year 13 in 2021. My favourite memory has got to be football - I really miss running and taking part in inter-house competitions. I'm also grateful to a lot of my teachers, as I feel I learnt so much from them about you really can achieve your goals if you work hard.

CIAG: What A Levels did you study?

Noah: I studied Maths, Biology and German at A Level. Biology was always my favourite subject as I really enjoyed learning about human anatomy and the cardiovascular system in particular. Maths was my strongest subject. During revision time, it was helpful to sometimes take a break from revising other subjects to do some past Maths papers, as this would give my selfesteem a boost. Studying a language at A Level was challenging but luckily I had two fantastic teachers who provided me with lots of support. Initially, I remember feeling quite overwhelmed by all the content, however engaging in speaking practice and Vocab Express everyday really helped! I would advise anyone who is struggling with learning a language to not give up, as all your hard work really does pay off in the end.

CIAG : What are you working on now?

Noah: In my undergraduate degree, I gained a real interest in medicine and I began looking into the idea of becoming a doctor. I was a little unsure at first as I felt perhaps I'd already committed to becoming a Sports Scientist, but then *I realised that it's impossible to know straight away what you want to do in life and it takes time to figure out who you are and who you want to be - and that's okay. I began reaching out to friends and family about work experience opportunities in a hospital setting. I was lucky enough to spend a week at Plymouth Hospital, observing doctors in the cardiac ward and ICU (intensive care unit). I was even invited into the operating room and got to watch a coronary artery bypass surgery - after this I knew that postgraduate medicine was something I wanted to go for. Last summer I took the GAMSAT exam required to apply for Graduate Entry Medicine. From my results, I was lucky enough to get an interview with Swansea University's Medical School for which I had to prepare for 2x 20 minute panel interviews and then give a 30 minute presentation on 'obesity and weight loss medications'. I felt most confident about the presentation as I knew this was the part of the interview I could control, so I put a lot of work into my slides and practiced giving the presentation over and over again. After the interview I felt nervous and relieved at the same time, but I knew I went in there as myself and had given it my all. A week or so later I heard back from Swansea and they offered me a place at their medical school beginning in September!*

Noah: Transitioning from secondary school to university can feel overwhelming, but it's an exciting opportunity for growth and exploration. While it's important to step out of your comfort zone, try new experiences and connect with others, remember to prioritise self-care and downtime. You don't need to attend every event or activity to make the most of your university experience. In your first year, it's common to question your choice of course, but don't be discouraged. As you progress, you'll discover which modules resonate with you, explore potential career paths and uncover opportunities for involvement. It's okay to take time to discover your passions and identity and if you find that your current course isn't right for you, know that many students change paths along the way.

My main intrigue for medicine was a dedication to helping others and my interest in biology and the intricacies of the human body. Also, being able to work in a competitive, fast-paced environment is essential to consider before applying to become a doctor. I think it's really important to rationally consider the idea before jumping head first into Graduate Entry Medicine (GEM) and so **having that work experience really helped me to make a decision**, as you won't know if it's something you'd like to do unless you've experienced it first hand. In terms of the actual process, you can apply for GEM through UCAS and it's an accelerated 4 year medical degree for post-graduates only, as opposed to a normal 5 year undergraduate degree. There's an option to take either the UCAT or GAMSAT exam; each university is different in terms of which exam they would like you to take. So I would say choose the exam that is most relevant to the universities you want to apply to. I know that both the exams are quite tough - I only took the GAMSAT, which was roughly 5 hours and involved an essay, comprehension and biology/chemistry sections. To the right is a photo of me taken just after I finished the exam - I might not look it but I had a massive headache and was exhausted. It's really helpful if you get in contact with someone who can advise you during the application process, as this provides you with some references and really helps calm the nerves. Mr Arthur very kindly helped me with my application process and did a fantastic job!
