

- BeeCreative: For 13-18-year-olds. BeeCreative deep-dives into creative arts, journalism and other wonderful pathways. Young people will get to create poems, music, art and clothing and much, much more!
- Urspace: For 16–18-year-olds. A bi-weekly wellbeing hub that gives young people space to develop their understanding of wellbeing (particularly looking at how to manage this during a busy time of schooling) through interactive workshops, creative sessions and discussion groups. It's a third space for your young people to study, chat, develop and find a moment of calm.
- Changemakers: For 16-18-year-olds. Our award winning bi-weekly youth group that aims at making social change in the community. Changemakers tackle social action projects and gain AQA qualifications where available. They also are first in line for exclusive events and opportunities such as stadium tours, meeting the players and trips to partners that other groups might not get!
- STEM Discovery Lab: For years 8-12. Helping young people develop their understanding of STEM through practical tasks and engineering workshops – our previous sessions have had visits from our players, and they've been raving about the great work the STEM Discovery Lab young people have been doing!




