More than 25 students from Years 7, 8 and 9 attended a morning with author Hilary McKay, as she read extracts from her book 'Skylark's War'.

The event was held at The Birkenhead High School Academy and students were given an explanation from Hilary as to how she researched and wrote the book.

Skylark's War is Historical Fiction, and is set during the First World War, and so Hilary explained how the children then were both different and similar to children now.
