

COVID-19 Catch Up Premium

The government COVID-19 catch-up premium has been established to mitigate the effects of the unique disruption caused by the coronavirus pandemic. The grant will only be available for the 2020-2021 academic year. Schools should use this funding for specific activities to support pupils to catch up for lost teaching time over the previous months.
