## **Learning Habit - Perfect Uniform**

Uniform is considered a very important aspect of our ethos and helps to set the tone for the positive learning environment that we have within school. We expect all our students to attend the school in full school uniform. You will note from my previous letter that we expect all students to **wear plain** black school shoes from Monday  $17^{th}$  April. (Year 7 - 10 only).









Our new term starts for students on **Monday 17**<sup>th</sup> **April 2023** and we reserve the right to send students home at the start of the day without further notice if they are not meeting our unform expectations, and we do not feel that all reasonable efforts have been made to resolve the issue. In these exceptional circumstances, your child would be sent home to resolve the issue and we would welcome them back to school as soon as possible so they can continue their learning once the problem has been resolved.

## **Learning Habit - Positive behaviour**

As I promised in my previous letter, we have been evaluating all aspects of our current practice to enrich the school experience for every student, this has included how we improve the climate for learning for the vast amount of students. We have high expectations, whilst sometimes this may be challenging, we expect our students to live by our learning habits 100% of the time. If they do this, their hard work will be recognised.

From **Monday 17**<sup>th</sup> **April**, students who persistently disrupt the learning of others will be issued with an appropriate school sanction. This will include:

### **Learning Habit - Attendance and Punctuality**

It is important for parents to be aware there is a clear link between attendance and student outcomes at GCSE. The school expectation is that students attend 100% of the time. There is no reason for children who attend Birkenhead Park School to attend less than their peers at other schools across the country. Your child will compete against these other students to gain the best GCSEs possible and the surest way to undermine your own child's success is to allow them to take time off. We need to work together to improve the life chances of the children who attend Birkenhead Park School.

**Tutor time starts at 8:35am**, punctuality is an important habit for working and we urge you to help your child develop this important skill. **Detentions will be given for students who arrive after 8:35am.** 

## **Learning Habit - Homework**

Please support your child in completing homework tasks. These are set every week and are sent home in student books. The expectation is they develop this as a learning habit. Homework club in available after school to support students who would like help. Detentions for not completing homework will be given out.

## **Learning Habit - Equipment**

BPS students have responded extremely positively to our expectations regarding equipment. It has been lovely to see so many students arriving to school fully equipped and ready to learn.
