THEME OF THE MONTH

BRITISH VALUES



Science

Year 10 students in Biology tackled some of the quesitons surrounding IVF, including it's availability for free on the NHS. Through their learning, students had to make an assessment on different case studies to decide whether or not they thought that the couple should be eligible for the NHS treatment.

History

Students have been learning about the Vietnam war, one of the most contentious conflicts in recent history. Through learning about the level of protest and massacre of innocent people associated with this war, they have been encouraged to consider the morality of ever entering such conflicts. We also then questioned the role of the USA in the world today, a nation so often at the forefront of global military operations.

Maths

We showed students how to measure BMI through taking measurements and creating grouped frequency charts. We used the data to make comparisons between healthy lifestyles, introducing the current social topic of obesity and showing the measurable side of healthy living.

Geography

Geography lessons have been focusing on the distribution of wealth across the globe. Students learned that 20% of people own 80% of the worlds wealth, and while India is amongst the poorest places in the world it still has the 10th most billionaires (111). Realising that there is often a starkly unequal gap between the richest and poorest, we asked students who should be respnsible for giving aid?



Victory in Europe Day

Birkenhead Park School celebrated the anniversary of the day in 1945 that marked Nazi Germany's unconditional surrender and consequently the end of World War II in Europe. Students worked on varioius art & craft projects at home before bringing them in to display and/or interact with each others work, getting them thinking about one of the biggest historical moments in British history.
