Our student Emmie completed the **'Must Know'** challenge, and has read **32** books so far, smashing the 16 classics before 16 challenge - well done Emmie!

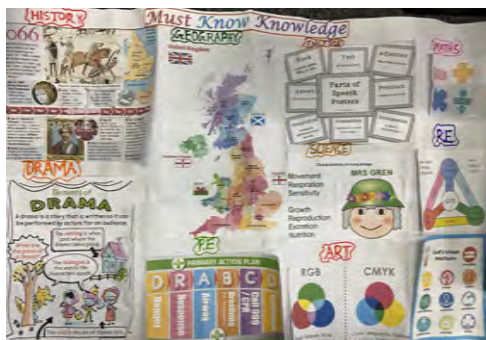


KS3 students have attended weekly **netball club**.

KS3 students have also taken part in the half-term **'Must Know'** challenge.

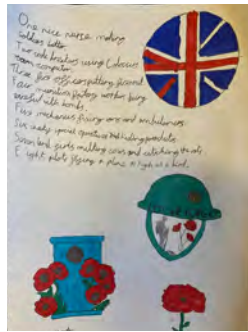


Students continue to receive careers information, advice and guidance every Tuesday lunch from **Wirral Met and BSFC**.

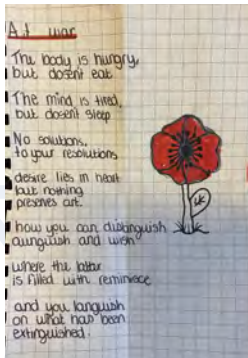




In support of **Remembrance Day**, students have created some amazing posters around school. The top three entries were Lucy, James and Jessica.
