#### **Students with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities**

Information about your child's individual needs is gathered during the transition period by key staff. The school's assessment and screening procedures are used to give us an up-to-date profile of learning needs against our thresholds for SEN support.

We have a strong team of Teaching Assistants and Teachers who specialise in providing a range of support strategies to ensure that every member of the school community thrives. Our focus is on providing high quality teaching which addresses any difficulties in the acquisition of literacy and/ or numeracy skills, and the social and emotional aspects of learning. We have close relationships with other agencies and incorporate specialist advice into Person Centred Plans where appropriate.

**Miss Weekes** is the Assistant Headteacher who coordinates all of the school's SEND provision.



# **COVID MEASURES**

## We will continue to follow government guidance and the following measures will be in place at the start of term:

#### In School:

**Good hand hygiene** - frequent and thorough handwashing should be regular practice amongst students and staff.

'Catch it, bin it, kill it' continues to be important

Enhanced cleaning regimes will continue throughout school

All rooms in the school will be well ventilated

Students should **NOT** attend school if they have any Covid symptoms, have had a positive test result or if there is another reason requiring them to stay at home due to the risk of them passing on Covid (e.g. required to quarantine).

Face masks, social distancing and student bubbles are no longer required but may be re-introduced based on local Public Health advice if infection rates are rising in the region.

# COVID TESTING

### **TESTING:**

Testing will continue to play an important role in the management of Covid. Students will be expected to do:

• **Two onsite lateral flow tests at the start of term** – these will be 3-5 days apart and students will be given full instructions and will be supervised when they take the tests.

• **Twice weekly lateral flow tests at home.** After their second onsite test, students will be given home testing kits and expected to do tests every 3-4 days at home and report their results. Full details will be given with the test kits. The requirement for home testing will be reviewed by the Government at the end of September.

Whilst participation in testing is voluntary, we strongly encourage students to play their part in keeping everyone in the school safe.

### **SELF ISOLATION:**

From September, the management of close contacts with a positive case will be done by NHS Test & Trace, not the school. In most cases students will no longer have to self-isolate if they are classed as a close contact but they will be asked by NHS Test & Trace to take a PCR test. Students can continue in school unless their PCR test result is positive.

If a student does have to self-isolate and is well enough, they will still be able to participate in their timetabled lessons/tutor time remotely via Microsoft Teams.

### WEEKS A/B

The above school timetable will operate on a two week cycle between **Week A** and **Week B**.

The timings of each day and the number of lessons remains the same between the two weeks. However, the content of your child's timetable will be different as they do different lessons in Week A compared to Week B.



To support travel to/from school we recognise that there is a safeguarding need for students to have a mobile phone. However, as mobile phones are a distraction to teaching and learning, if a student chooses to bring a mobile phone to school it is on the understanding that they agree to the following actions:

• Mobile phones must be switched off and placed in their school bag as they enter the school building. It is not acceptable for phones to go in coat/blazer pockets.

• The phone must be kept in the school bag until the students leave the building at 3pm.

• The school accepts no liability for lost or damaged mobile phones, and they remain the student's responsibility if they choose to bring it to school.

# School UNIFORM

The school uniform is considered a very important aspect of the school ethos and full uniform is expected to be worn by all of our students every day.

#### The uniform consists of:

- A black blazer with a red trim and the school badge
- A white shirt/blouse
- School clip-on tie; no other type is permitted
- Black school trousers or black skirt - girls' trousers must be tailored
- Flat, plain black shoes, or all black trainers (boots and training shoes are not permitted)
- A school jumper, tank top or black cardigan may be worn provided they are fine knit
- Plain black or white socks, black tights

#### **PE Kit:**

All PE Kit has to have The Birkenhead Park School logo on:

- Black and red polo shirt with logo (girls)
- Black and red Football top with logo (boys)
- Black and red shorts with logo
- Black socks
- Trainers
- Football boots/shin pads (optional)
- Towel


"Ambition and excellence for all" is what we strive for at BPS, and developing a love reading is key to academic success. Students in Year 7, 8 and 9 take part in our 'Big Read'. Each morning students read for 30 minutes with their form tutor and follow along using their own personalised bookmarks.

There are a great range of books covering different themes, issues and cultures which also include some ambitious texts. We are dedicated to closing the reading and vocabulary gap and have carefully selected this strategy based on clear research that has been proven to work.

Each form tutor has read the book that students will read and produced inspiring assemblies to introduce the book, knowledge organisers that allow us to delve into the meaning of selected vocabulary and a range of discussion questions so that students can share their own views and experiences. The Big Read will improve students' reading and vocabulary and also ignite a love of reading.

Learning to read is about understanding as well as working out what's printed on the page. Through reading, children are exposed to a wide range of words. This helps them build their own vocabulary and improve their understanding and allow them to express themselves confidently. It's important for them to become 'word rich' so that they can write and speak confidently and fluently. This is a skill that benefits young people and leads to academic success but also lasts a lifetime.
