<p>Developing deep thinking and questioning through music about the way in which the world works promotes spiritual growth.</p> <p>We aim to give all students an open-minded view of the wider world through the teaching of Music.</p> <p>We promote a sense of curiosity in the world and other cultures.</p> <p>We aim to be consistently enthusiastic about the music we teach (and others we don't) and to use a range of teaching strategies that allow pupils to be creative or imaginative.</p> <p>We aim to make students aware of the similarities and differences between them and people who live in a different country and the meaning of music on their spirituality.</p> <p>Students will be made aware of the different religious festivals and how music is used with these festivals in different countries.</p> <p>We will aim to make students aware of the values which exist in other countries, through religious music and beliefs (e.g. Rastafarianism influence on Reggae)</p>	<p>Within the classroom, we encourage respect and reward good behaviour. We value listening to others' views and opinions on suggested answers.</p> <p>Students recognise that music can do used to deliver a moral or political message. This is not necessarily everyone's view.</p> <p>We promote discussion about music views on a variety of subjects.</p> <p>Moral development in Music is also about students gaining an understanding of the range of views and the reasons for the range. It is also about developing an opinion about the different views.</p> <p>Authentic target language texts are selected that extend students' ideas and their moral and emotional understanding.</p> <p>Our focus for Our World Our Thoughts is centred around moral issues in a global society context including the view of compulsory teaching of a music</p>	<p>In the classroom, we use every opportunity for students to use whiteboards to promote build self-confidence and encourage resilience and respect for each other.</p> <p>We encourage collaborative learning in the classroom – in the form of listening and learning from each other and paired discussion / working partners in order to show that the result is often better than they could achieve alone.</p> <p>We focus on the development of the skills and personal qualities necessary for creative performance and composition within music and what this means living and working together in a multi-racial, multi-cultural society.</p> <p>We encourage students to enjoy their success in music and will celebrate accordingly whilst supporting any short term failure through interventions as and when required. Social development is aided further by fostering an evaluative approach when reviewing their music work and that of composers and their peers.</p> <p>Music students learn in a safe environment conducive to collaboration and the sharing of ideas.</p>	<p>Opportunities to explore different musical styles from around the world.</p> <p>Students are encouraged to embrace other cultures and accept that things are not weird, just different.</p> <p>Students are encouraged to have an openness to explore and perform in different styles and being exposed to styles from different cultures.</p> <p>Students are directed to view and exposed to a variety of film music and music from different times and places. We aim to help student develop an interest in music outside of their current listening genre.</p>
