To the Parents of Year 11 students in September 2023

Dear Parents and Carers

Firstly, can I take the opportunity to thank you for your support during what has been a hugely successful school year. Our drive to raise standards has continued and our school community has responded extremely positively to these higher expectations. Our success this year now leaves us well placed to continue on our journey of transformation and I am confident that we will improve the school and enrich the school experience for every student.

As you are already aware, the Birkenhead Park School Learning Habits provide a framework to ensure our core values (Positivity, Ambition, Resilience, Thoughtful) are embedded within our daily practice. Every student is expected to uphold these values.

Our Learning Habits are:

- Perfect Unform
- Positive Behaviour
- Punctuality and Attendance
- Homework
- Equipment

I have written home on a number of occasions during this school year to explain how you can support your child in developing these positive learning habits. To further support your child over the summer break and to allow a positive start to the new school year, I have listed the school's expectations below.

Learning Habit – Perfect Unform

Full school uniform is expected to be worn by all students every day.

Year 11 only

Instead of the school blazer, students should wear a professional looking black suit jacket. Girls must wear an open neck revere blouse with no tie. Boys should wear a **plain**, **dark green tie**.

- A black blazer with a red trim and the school badge
- A white shirt/blouse
- School clip-on tie; no other type is permitted
- Black school trousers or black skirt girls' trousers must be tailored
- Plain black shoes
- A school jumper or black cardigan may be worn provided they are fine knit.
- Plain black or white socks, black tights
- School lanyard and timetable



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You will note that I have highlighted **plain black shoes**, to avoid you spending a significant amount of money on inappropriate shoes/trainers, I have also enclosed a leaflet on what is and isn't acceptable.

For reference, the following are **NOT acceptable**:

- Bodycon skirt
- Trainers
- Walking/softshell trousers
- Tracksuit bottoms
- False nails (including coloured or French polish)
- Painted nails/ Shellac/ gel only clear or natural nail polish is permitted
- False eyelashes
- Fake tan or spray tan that does not look natural
- Facial piercings
- Extreme hair colours (only natural looking colours are permitted)
- Extreme hair styles
- Jewellery (including rings, bracelets, bangles)

Learning Habit – Equipment

Students are required to have the following items:

- Pencil case
- Black or blue pen
- Red pen
- Pencil
- Ruler
- Rubber
- Highlighter

It is important that students are fully equipped for all lessons as this maximises learning time for students, to support our students we will re-issue equipment at the start of the new school year.

Learning Habit - Punctuality and Attendance

There is a clear link between attendance and student outcomes at GCSE. The school's expectation is that students attend 100% of the time. There is no reason for children who attend Birkenhead Park School to attend less than their peers at other schools across the country. Your child will compete against these other students to gain the best GCSEs possible and the surest way to undermine your own child's success is to allow them to take time off. The new school year is the perfect opportunity to work with us to break any old habits and establish positive routines to support 100% attendance.

Year 7 – 11 Awards Afternoons

It has been a great couple of weeks celebrating the achievements of our students in Year 7 - 11 at the awards afternoon events. Students received prizes for their hard work, attendance and upholding our school values in everything they do. Well done to everyone who received an award.
