Update from School Governors on the School's Response to Ofsted

During the meeting on May 22nd Governors were informed of strong progress being made towards more positive outcomes in years 6 and 11, with internal data suggesting that results would improve. There was also information about upcoming changes to the rewards and behaviour systems and how the school was addressing issues related to the conduct of students in school. There was also a recognition that the plan for improvement may need to undergo some changes in response to feedback from the DfE to more clearly exemplify future progress.

The School Governors will update parents about this area following the half-termly governors meetings.

What have we been up to this week?

Phonics Screening and Y4 Multiplication Check have taken place in primary this week. All children who have taken part in these external accountability measures have tried their very best and we are incredibly proud of them! Well done to all!

All primary children had a visit from Bright Bites this week who gave advice on the importance of oral health habits and good dental hygiene. Your child will shortly be coming home with a new toothbrush and toothpaste.

As we end another busy week, we want to thank all secondary students for their continued focus and positivity around school. A special well done goes to our Year 11s, who have now completed their final full week of exams – we are incredibly proud of the maturity, resilience, and determination they've shown throughout. Across all year groups, it's been great to see so many of them demonstrating our core values of being *Ready, Respectful, and Safe*, both in and out of the classroom. Let's keep the momentum going as we head into the final weeks of the term.

Ready, Respectful, Safe

This week in our Primary RRS Behaviour Curriculum, we introduced our **Playground Ready, Respectful, Safe expectations** to help all children understand how to make positive choices during playtimes and lunchtimes. Unstructured times are an important part of the school day where social skills, friendships, and independence are developed. By applying our Ready, Respectful, Safe values in the playground, children learn how to play kindly, include others, solve small problems calmly, and move around safely. These expectations support a happy, inclusive environment where every child feels safe and valued — both inside and outside the classroom.

As part of our **RRS (Ready, Respectful, Safe) curriculum next week**, we'll be using the story *Moggy's Coming* by Tim Hodgetts and Andy Thurgood. This age-appropriate resource, produced by **CitizenAID in partnership with the Government Security Office**, helps children recognise when something doesn't feel safe and what to do in those situations. It teaches them to trust their feelings, notice early warning signs, and speak to a trusted adult — helping us prepare children for real-life situations and keep them safe both in and out of school.

This week in secondary, we continue to strengthen the culture of high expectations across our phase by embedding the core principles of **Ready, Respectful, Safe (RRS)** in every classroom, corridor, and communal space. We are committed to ensuring these values are not just known but *lived* by every student, every day.

Readiness remains a key focus—students must arrive on time, with the right mindset and full equipment, including their **Yondr pouch**, which is a required part of their daily school kit. Coming to school fully prepared sets the tone for focused, disruption-free learning.

Our **Respectful** culture is being reinforced through consistent modelling by staff and clear expectations around language, interactions, and conduct. Students are reminded that **earrings must be small studs only**, and **no loops**, **rings or large jewellery** is permitted in line with our uniform policy.







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Safety—both physical and emotional—continues to be a non-negotiable. Our lunchtime reflection for pre-lunch behaviour points provides a clear, consistent consequence that supports student accountability while ensuring wellbeing needs (like eating and toilet use) are respected.

We are also reinforcing our **uniform standards**, which are central to our shared identity. Students must wear a **Unity jumper with the logo** and **plain black footwear**, with no coloured logos, soles, or trims. These standards apply daily and contribute to our calm, purposeful atmosphere.

Positive behaviour continues to be recognised and celebrated. Weekly praise in assemblies and tutor time highlights students who consistently demonstrate RRS values, with half-termly rewards for those who go above and beyond.

Finally, we remain committed to **open communication with families**. Text messages are used to share both positive news and behavioural concerns, helping ensure parents and carers are fully informed and involved in their child's success.
